# Devotional: Embracing God's Peace in Troubling Times

## Devotional: Finding Strength and Refuge in God

Feeling vulnerable is common after experiencing war and its impact on faith. Psalm 46:1 reveals a profound truth: God is our refuge—our safe place—and our strength during times of trouble.

### Devotional: God's Promise to Heal Broken Hearts

The scars left by war extend beyond the body; the soul can carry deep wounds that are hard to see. Psalm 147:3 offers a comforting promise—God heals the brokenhearted and binds their wounds.

Religious disillusionment may have made you feel abandoned or betrayed, but God's heart is full of compassion. He understands your pain intimately and longs to bring restoration.

Healing is a process, not a quick fix. It requires trusting God with your brokenness and allowing Him to work His restorative power one step at a time. As you reflect on this promise, open your heart to His healing touch and know you are not alone.

## **Prayer for Today**

**Lord Jesus,** You know the depth of my brokenness and the wounds buried deep within my soul. I ask for Your healing touch to bind my hurt and make me whole again. Help me to trust that restoration is possible, even when the pain feels overwhelming. Infuse my heart with hope and renew my faith as You mend every part of me. 2 Corinthians 12:9 - "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Isaiah 40:31 "Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength."
- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."







# Devotional: God's Power Shines Through Our Weakness

In moments of spiritual and emotional weakness, it's easy to feel like giving up. But Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians that God's grace is enough—His power shines brightest when we are weak.

This counters the misconception that faith must be strong and unwavering at all times. Instead, vulnerability creates space for Christ's power to work through us.

Consider what it means to accept your weakness and let God's grace fill the gaps. Rather than hiding doubts or wounds, bring them honestly before God. In this humility, you allow His strength to rebuild your faith and renew your hope, step by step.

1.	How have you experienced God's grace in your weakest moments?
2.	What fears or barriers do you have about admitting spiritual weakness?
3.	How can embracing weakness help you grow closer to God?

1.	Write about a time when God strengthened you through weakness.
2.	List ways you avoid acknowledging your spiritual struggles.
3.	Reflect on what it means to boast in weakness as Paul did.

## Devotional: Embracing God's New Mercies Daily

After enduring disillusionment, hope can feel distant or fragile. Yet Lamentations reminds us of God's unwavering compassion and daily renewal. No matter our past, each day brings a fresh chance to experience His faithfulness.

Rebuilding faith requires renewed hope—a belief that God has not forgotten and that better things lie ahead. Trust may be tentative, but God's steadfast love invites us to take that risk again.

Reflect on God's mercies which are new every morning. Let this promise encourage you to keep moving forward, knowing that God's faithfulness is a foundation you can stand on no matter what you've faced.

# Devotional: Anchoring Your Hope in God's Faithfulness
