Your Verse

Galatians 2:20 "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me."

Supporting Scriptures

- *2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"*
- *Ephesians 2:10 "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works."*



Devotional: Embrace Your New Identity in Christ

Many veterans wrestle with identity after service, wondering who they are without their rank or uniform. Paul's words in Galatians 2:20 remind us that our old self, defined by past roles or achievements, is transformed through Christ. When we are in Him, a new identity emerges that transcends circumstances.

Your identity is now found in being "crucified with Christ." This means letting go of former labels and embracing the life Jesus gives—a life marked by purpose, love, and new beginnings.

Rather than clinging to former definitions, open your heart to God's new creation. You are crafted uniquely for good works prepared beforehand by God.

Day 2: Transitioning with Grace



Your Verse

Isaiah 43:19 "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?"

Supporting Scriptures

- *Philippians 3:13 "Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead."*
- *Psalms 40:3 "He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God."*



Devotional: Trusting God's New Work in Transition

Transitions can be difficult, filled with uncertainty and longing for what once was. Isaiah 43:19 encourages us to perceive the "new thing" God is doing in our lives. Although change may feel overwhelming, God is actively working to bring renewal and hope.

Leaving military service is not an end but the start of a new chapter. Like a song put in our mouths, our stories continue with fresh melodies reflecting God's faithfulness and grace.

Day 2:  Transitioning with Grace

Prayer for Today

Day 3: Finding Strength in Weakness



Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."*
- *Psalms 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."*



Devotional: Embracing God's Strength in Weakness

It's normal to feel vulnerable when stepping into unfamiliar territory after military service. Paul's reminder in 2 Corinthians shows that God's grace is enough, and His power shines brightest in our weakness.

Rather than fighting to appear strong on your own, invite God's power to work through your limitations. True strength comes not from self-reliance but from dependence on Him.

Isaiah assures us God strengthens the weary; Psalm 46 calls Him our refuge and help. In these promises, find comfort amid uncertainty.

Let today's reflection encourage you to lean into God's all-sufficient grace and trust Him to sustain you through every challenge and change.

Your Verse

- *Romans 8:28 "In all things God works for the good of those who love him."*



Devotional: Trust and Grow in God's Good Plan
