#### Your Verse

Psalm 139:13-14 "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Jeremiah 1:5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."
- Romans 8:38–39 "...neither death nor life... neither height nor depth... nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

### Devotional: Knowing God Crafted You With Intentional Love

When rejection strikes, it shakes the core of our identity. It makes us question if we're enough or if we truly belong. Yet, Psalm 139 boldly reminds us that our identity is deeply rooted in God's intimate, intentional creation of us. Each of us is "fearfully and wonderfully made." This means that even before we took our first breath, God lovingly formed every part of us — body, soul, and purpose.

Remember: your worth is not determined by human approval or circumstances. Jeremiah reminds us that God sets us apart for significance before we were even born. While the world may reject or misunderstand you, God delights in you and calls you by name.

When doubt or rejection tries to whisper lies, cling tightly to the truth that nothing can separate you from God's love, as Paul assures in Romans. Not rejection, not failure, not isolation — can sever His unbreakable bond with you.

Galatians 3:26 "So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 1 John 3:1 "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!"
- Romans 8:16 "The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children."







### Devotional: Living Confidently as God's Beloved Daughter

Your identity as a child of God is the foundation of your true worth. Galatians 3:26 teaches us that through faith in Jesus, you are no longer defined by rejection or past hurts but as a beloved daughter of the King. This truth transforms everything.

Rejection in our lives can cause us to isolate or shrink, but understanding that we are lavished with God's love as His children offers freedom. 1 John 3:1 reveals that the Father's love for us is so great that He calls us His own, giving us an eternal family and unshakeable belonging.

Even when you feel unworthy or distant, the Holy Spirit reassures you internally of your royal identity (Romans 8:16). The Spirit's witness within you is more significant than any worldly rejection.

Remember today that your standing before God is unchangeable. You are called, chosen, and deeply loved. Reject the lies that tell you otherwise and walk boldly as a daughter crowned with purpose and dignity.

Day 3: X Finding Strength in Biblical Women's Stories

#### Devotional: Learning from Women Who Overcame Rejection

Throughout the Bible, women faced rejection, loss, and uncertainty, yet God used their faithfulness to bring about His purposes. Ruth's loyalty and courage amidst loss teach us about steadfastness despite rejection by society and family. Her statement in Ruth 1:16 reveals a heart committed to God and new identity beyond past pain.

Similarly, Hannah's heartfelt prayer shows how turning to God with honesty and trust transforms sorrow into joy (1 Samuel 1:27). Instead of letting rejection define her, she sought God's peace and purpose.

Esther's bravery in the face of great danger reminds us that God positions us exactly where we need to be—even if rejection or fear tries to paralyze us. Esther 4:14 challenges us to recognize God's timing and divine assignment in our own lives.

As you reflect on these stories, consider how God's strength empowered these women and how He can empower you. You are not alone in your experience, and your story is still unfolding under God's sovereign hand.

- Philippians 4:13 "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."







#### Devotional: God's Power in Our Weakness

**Rejection can leave us feeling weak, disheartened, and discouraged.** But Isaiah 41:10 assures us: God is with us—offering strength and help. We do not have to rely on our own power to overcome pain or rejection.

Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 12:9 emphasize that in our weaknesses, God's grace shines brightest. When rejection threatens to rob you of joy or confidence, lean into His sustaining power.

### Devotional: God's Compassion Renewing Your Spirit Daily

Rejection can feel like it consumes us, leaving wounds that seem impossible to heal. Yet Lamentations reminds us that God's compassion never fails and His mercies are new every morning. This means no matter how deep the hurt, we can experience fresh grace daily.

Grace is more than forgiveness; it's the restoring power of God's love in our brokenness. Ephesians 2:8 celebrates that this grace is a gift, not earned or dependent on our performance or acceptance by others.

Titus 2:11 confirms that God's grace offers salvation and restoration freely to all, including women wrestling with rejection and identity struggles.

Whatever rejection you are carrying today, invite God's grace to heal and restore your heart. Let His faithfulness renew your spirit and remind you that your future is secure in Him.

#### Your Verse

- Ephesians 4:22–24 "...put off your old self... and put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness."







Day 6: C Embracing Your New Identity in Christ

### Devotional: Walking in the Freedom of Your New Creation

**Rejection often ties us to old wounds and false identities.** But 2 Corinthians 5:17 proclaims that in Christ, we are new creations. The past has been forgiven and transformed. We do not need to live defined by rejection or pain anymore.

Colossians encourages us to let this new identity overflow into how we live—with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience toward ourselves and others. Embracing your new self includes embodying God's character.

- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."
- Psalm 46:5 "God is within her, she will not fall; God will help her at break of day."







### Devotional: Confidently Moving Ahead in Your God-Given Calling
