#### Your Verse

Psalm 139:13-14 - "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well."

- Jeremiah 1:5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart."
- Ephesians 2:10 "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."







#### Devotional: You Are Fearfully and Wonderfully Made

**Today, reflect on who you are from God's perspective.** Often caregiving roles can feel all-consuming, and we may begin to see ourselves solely in what we've done or the needs we've met. But Psalm 139 reminds us that our identity is wonderfully crafted by God Himself. *You are fearfully and wonderfully made, uniquely designed with purpose beyond any temporary role.* 

God knew you intimately before you were even born – that's not just comforting; it's revolutionary! Your worth is rooted not in your caregiving, your productivity, or the approval of others, but in who God created you to be. You are His masterpiece, and your life has divine significance.

**Pause today** and thank God for creating you with such intentionality. Ask Him to reveal any false identity or limiting thoughts you've adopted because of caregiving pressures. Invite His truth to redefine your self-view as you move forward into new seasons.

- Isaiah 40:31 "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength."







#### Devotional: Finding Rest for the Weary Soul

Caregiving often brings deep weariness, both physical and emotional. The constant giving can leave your soul feeling depleted, longing for restoration. Jesus invites you today to lay down your heavy burdens. *He alone can give true rest and refreshment beyond what the world or your circumstances can offer.* 

Jesus' words to the weary carry such promise. You do not have to carry the weight alone anymore. His yoke is gentle and His burden is light. When you entrust your cares to Him, He restores your soul, replenishes your spirit, and guides you on paths that bring peace.

Take practical moments today to rest deeply in His presence—whether through prayer, worship, or quiet reflection.
