
Reflecting on the Ascension: A Holiday of Hope


Let's embark on this journey together to understand this important holiday and to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Holy Spirit and the fulfillment of God's purposes in our lives.

Devotional: Understanding the Promise Beyond Earth

Devotional: Empowered by the Spirit for Every Step
