Luke 1:26–28 – "In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, to a virgin named Mary..."

- Isaiah 7:14 "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel."
- Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord.







Devotional: God's Perfect Plan Unfolds in Surprise

The Annunciation marks a moment when God reveals His perfect plan for salvation. Through the humble town of Nazareth and a young woman, God begins to fulfill His ancient promises. As we read in Luke 1:26–28, the angel Gabriel comes with a message filled with awe, hope, and divine purpose.

Isaiah's prophecy reminds us this was no ordinary child but Immanuel—"God with us." The Lord's plans are never random or accidental; they are a tapestry woven with precision and love (Jeremiah 29:11). Sometimes, the way God works surprises us, appearing in unexpected places and through unlikely people.

Reflecting on this, we can trust that God's plans today, too, are good and perfect, even when they feel uncertain or startling. Like Mary, we can receive God's message with wonder and openness. The Feast of the Annunciation invites us to marvel at God's faithfulness and to watch for His unfolding story in our own lives.

- Acts 1:8 "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you..."
- Romans 8:11 "The Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you."







Devotional: Holy Spirit's Role in God's Miraculous Work

The Annunciation centers on the miraculous work of the Holy Spirit in Mary's life. When Gabriel tells Mary that she will conceive by the Holy Spirit's power, it highlights God's supernatural involvement in redemption.

This same Spirit is at work in us today. Acts 1:8 promises power for boldness and witness, and Romans 8:11 assures us of resurrection life within. The Holy Spirit enables what human effort alone cannot. Mary's courage and obedience were strengthened by this divine presence.

As we celebrate this holy season, we are invited to recognize and invite the Holy Spirit's presence more fully into our own lives to empower, comfort, and guide us. Whether in moments of joy or challenge, the Spirit brings God's life-giving power.

Day 3: W Mary's Yes: Embracing God's Will

Devotional: Responding with Faith and Obedience

Mary's response to Gabriel's message is a beautiful example of faith and surrender. In Luke 1:38, she willingly accepts God's plan, becoming the 'Lord's servant.' Her humble yet brave 'yes' transforms history and models a heart fully committed to God's will.

The psalmist echoes this heart attitude in Psalm 40:8, delighting in doing God's will, and Paul urges believers to offer themselves wholly in worship and obedience (Romans 12:1). Mary's example challenges us to consider our own response to God's voice.

In this season, we are invited to say "yes" to God's calling, even when it is uncertain or difficult, trusting that His plans lead to abundant life and blessing. Faith moves beyond feelings into intentional surrender.

Day 4: **5** Rejoicing in God's Faithfulness

Devotional: A Heart of Joy and Praise

Mary's song, the Magnificat, bursts forth from a heart rejoicing in God's mighty work. Her praise declares God's faithfulness across generations and His role as Savior (Luke 1:46–47). This hymn models a spirit of gratitude and awe that transcends circumstances.

Similarly, the psalmist commits to singing God's great love and faithfulness (Psalm 89:1), and Habakkuk chooses joy in God amid trials (Habakkuk 3:18). True celebration springs from recognizing who God is and what He has done.

At this holiday season's heart stands deep rejoicing—for the gift of Jesus, God's faithfulness fulfilled in Him, and the hope that this brings. Cultivating praise renews our spirit and aligns our hearts with God's glorious character.

Devotional: Embodying God's Plan Every Day

The Feast of the Annunciation is not just a historical event but a call to daily transformation. Galatians 2:20 reminds us that through Christ, a new life has begun within us. We are invited to live as new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17), reflecting Jesus' love and purpose in all we do.

Like Mary, who embraced God's plan physically and spiritually, we too live the Annunciation by saying yes to God's presence within and by allowing Him to work through us. Colossians encourages us to perform all actions in Jesus' name—making ordinary days sacred offerings.
