Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."







Devotional: God's Nearness Brings Peace and Rest

When chronic dizziness strikes, it can leave you feeling brokenhearted and defeated. But **the Lord promises to be near in those difficult moments.** Psalm 34:18 reassures us that God is close to the brokenhearted and saves those whose spirits are crushed. This isn't just a distant hope; it's an intimate reality. *God is not far away, watching passively—He draws near when we hurt.*

In Isaiah 41:10, God speaks directly to our fears and tells us not to be afraid or dismayed because He is with us. This presence is our source of peace amid dizziness and uncertainty. Devotional: Hope in God Revives Our Strength

Chronic dizziness might drain your body's energy, but **God wants to renew** your strength through hope anchored in Him. Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 18:10 "The name of the LORD is a fortified tower; the righteous run to it and are safe."







Devotional: God Is Our Strong Refuge Always

When chronic dizziness makes you feel vulnerable, **remember that God is your refuge and protector.** Psalm 46:1 assures us that God provides strength and help that never fades. No matter how disorienting physical symptoms can be, He stands ready to be your safe place.

David's song in 2 Samuel 22:3 expresses deep trust in God as a rock—a stable foundation when life feels shaky. Proverbs 18:10 further describes God's name as a fortified tower where we find safety. These metaphors remind us that in God's presence we are shielded from panic and despair.

Reach out for God's protection daily. Imagine stepping into a strong tower where dizziness cannot reach your heart. Trust that He not only protects your body but guards your peace and hope.

Jeremiah 30:17 – "I will restore you to health and heal your wounds," declares the LORD.

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- James 5:15 "The prayer of faith will save the sick."







Devotional: God Promises Healing and Restoration

Chronic dizziness often involves both physical symptoms and emotional exhaustion. **God's healing extends to the whole person** — **body, mind, and soul.** Jeremiah 30:17 contains a hopeful promise from the Lord to restore health and heal wounds. This restoration is a divine work, inviting you to believe in God's power to renew you.

Devotional: God's Peace Guards Our Anxious Hearts

Dealing with chronic dizziness can stir anxiety and fear, robbing you of peace. Yet Scripture offers a powerful antidote: **God's peace that surpasses human understanding.** Philippians 4:6-7 instructs us not to be anxious but to present our requests to God through prayer and thanksgiving. The resulting peace acts like a guard, protecting our hearts and minds from turmoil.

Jesus assures us in John 14:27 that He gives a peace unlike what the world offers—calmness even amid chaos. 1 Peter 5:7 invites us to cast all anxiety on God because He cares deeply for us.

Trust God's peace to calm your fears and anxiety. When dizziness triggers worry, take those feelings to Him in prayer. Rest in the security of His loving care and allow His peace to be your constant companion.

Day 6: 🛠 Strength in Our Weakness

Devotional: God's Power Perfected in Weakness
