Devotional: Start by Renewing Your Mind Today

Our minds are battlegrounds for the influence of the world, especially in the digital age. Technology constantly exposes us to endless streams of information, notifications, and distractions designed to capture our attention. This can make it hard to focus, leading to mental fatigue and addictive behavior.

Paul's reminder in Romans 12:2 urges us not to conform to worldly patterns but to be transformed through *renewing our minds*. Instead of passive consumption, we need active engagement with God's truth, which recalibrates our thinking and priorities.

God's peace is not dependent on circumstances or constant connection but on trusting Him. When anxiety arises, we can choose to turn to Christ instead of scrolling endlessly. This choice protects our mental and spiritual wellbeing.

Triggers can be boredom, loneliness, stress, or emotional pain, causing us to reach reflexively for technology. By identifying these triggers, we gain clarity and can seek God's help to respond differently.

Today, ask God to reveal your hidden triggers and be willing to face them with courage and grace.
