When addiction to overachievement grips us, we may subconsciously believe that God's love or our value depends on what we do. But this passage shatters that lie. We cannot boast in our achievements because our worth is rooted in Christ alone.

Breaking free means embracing this truth daily. It's a process of unlearning performance-based value and resting confidently in God's unmerited favor. Reflect on how much mental and emotional energy you spend trying to earn approval. Imagine releasing that and receiving God's grace as a gift rather than a reward.

Today, affirm that your salvation and worth come through faith, not through your works. This truth is your freedom!

Micah 6:8 beautifully summarizes what God desires: justice, mercy, and humility in our walk with Him. Success before God is not about endless accomplishment, but a heart aligned with His character.

Matthew 6:33 reminds us that prioritizing God's kingdom brings provision and purpose. Colossians encourages wholehearted work done for God's glory, not merely to impress others. When we redefine success by these standards, the pressure to perform to gain approval loses its grip.

How can you begin to shift your focus from outward achievement to inward obedience and humility? God desires hearts transformed, not just tasks completed. Today, ask God to help you embrace this Godly perspective on success, freeing you from the addiction of performance.

#### Devotional: God's Love Frees Us From Performance

Romans 8:38–39 is a powerful declaration that no circumstance or failure can separate us from God's love. 1 John 3:1 echoes this by reminding us that we are dearly loved children of God. Jeremiah 31 calls it an everlasting love — a love independent of our performance.

As you rest in God's unshakable love, let it transform your self-worth. You don't have to earn this love; it is your birthright in Christ. Today, thank God for loving you completely, and let that love free you from the need to prove yourself.

Surrender is an act of faith, acknowledging God's wisdom over our plans. When we submit to Him, He promises to direct our paths. Psalm 37 and Isaiah 26 speak of peace that flows from trust—peace that overcomes anxiety tied to performance pressures.

Today, ask God to reveal areas where control dominates your efforts and offer them up. Choosing to trust is stepping into freedom from the addiction to perform and achieve.

Our human limitations are not failures but opportunities to experience God's sustaining power more deeply. Psalm 73 and Isaiah echo this promise of renewed strength amid weakness.

Embrace your weaknesses today — not as flaws to hide but as places where God's grace shines brightest. This mindset frees us from the pressure to appear strong through constant achievement.
