#### Devotional: Embracing God in Marriage Loneliness

Loneliness within marriage is often a silent pain, a feeling that you carry alone even when next to your spouse. It can stem from unmet emotional needs, lack of communication, or the pressures of daily life. Today, accept the truth that your feelings are valid and recognized by God.

Day 3: 💋 Healing the Wounds of the Past

#### Devotional: God's Healing Touch on Past Hurts

Loneliness in marriage often links to old wounds—past hurts, unmet expectations, or unresolved conflicts that build walls around the heart. Healing these hurts is essential to restore closeness.

**Isaiah 41:10** offers us a powerful promise: God is our ever-present strength and help in times of fear and discouragement. We don't have to carry our wounds alone because He faithfully upholds us.

*Psalm 147:3* assures us that God actively heals the brokenhearted, binding their wounds, both seen and unseen. His healing flows from an *everlasting love* and kindness (*Jeremiah 31:3*)—perfect love that reaches where human connection sometimes cannot.

**Philippians 4:4** encourages continual rejoicing in the Lord, a practice that refocuses our hearts on His goodness rather than circumstances.
