How to use this study? Engage with each day intentionally — read the Scriptures carefully, meditate on the devotional, answer reflective questions honestly, and write openly in your journal. Devotional: Finding Rest in God Before Reconnecting

Rest is the first step to renewal. In the busyness of daily life, especially in marriage, it's easy to become fatigued physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Often, we try to fix disconnect by doing more — plans, conversations, activities — but God invites us to stop and rest in Him first.

Jesus calls out to all who feel overwhelmed to come to Him for rest. This is not just physical rest but a deep soul rest that restores our hearts and minds. Before trying to reconnect with your spouse through effort alone, pause together and invite God's peace into your relationship.

Being 'quick to listen and slow to speak' helps us create space for one another's thoughts and feelings. This balance fosters trust and diminishes misunderstandings. Today's focus is on creating a safe environment where honest communication flourishes, even when it's uncomfortable.

In your journal, confess: Are there words you've held back out of fear or habit? How has busyness prevented open dialogue? Pray together seeking God's grace to grow in truthful, loving conversations. Commit to moments today where you listen deeply without distraction.

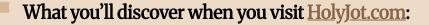




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
