Day 1: V Facing Shame with Courage

Devotional: God Is Near the Brokenhearted Always

Shame can feel like a heavy chain, binding us and distorting how we view ourselves. But God's Word reminds us He is near the brokenhearted. You are not alone in your pain or shame. Devotional: You Are a New Creation in Christ
