1 Peter reminds husbands to treat their wives considerately, honouring them as precious and equal heirs of God's grace. Gentle touch nurtures connection and signals safety, especially where walls have risen.

What ways can you begin to offer gentle, respectful touch without expectation? This may include holding hands, a comforting hug, or a light touch on the shoulder. Small affirmations of physical presence build emotional safety over time.

Invite God's grace to guide your hands and heart, remembering that intimacy is a gift to be cherished and renewed with tenderness.
