Devotional: Return to Your First Love

Stress, criticism, and temptation can infiltrate even the best of pastors. You need God's peace to guard your heart and mind (Philippians 4:7) and to stay alert spiritually (1 Peter 5:8). Take intentional steps to rest, renew, and set healthy boundaries.

Guarding your heart means saying no to distractions and yes to what refreshes and strengthens your spirit. This healthy protection enables you to preach and lead with clarity and passion.

Jesus taught humility and servant-heartedness as the path to greatness (Philippians 2:3–4). He humbly washed His disciples' feet, modeling love in action (John 13:14). When your ministry focuses on serving God's people selflessly, you tap into a deep and lasting well of passion and joy.

Shift your focus from impressing others to faithfully serving them. Let humility and love motivate your preaching and leadership. This posture revives your calling and keeps your heart vibrant.

Devotional: Humble Dependence on God

It is easy for pastors to try to do ministry through their own power, but Jesus reminds us clearly that nothing is possible apart from Him. True passion springs from dependence on God, acknowledging your need for His guidance, strength, and wisdom.

David lifted his eyes, realizing that help comes from the Lord, not from self-effort or resources. James teaches that humility invites God's favor, while pride blocks it.

Today, choose humble dependence over independence. Cast your burdens on the Lord and lean on His strength rather than your own. This shift will bring renewed passion and effectiveness.
