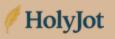

As you commit to this study, remember: humility is not weakness but strength under control, and dependence on God is the foundation for effective and lasting ministry. May this time draw you closer to Christ, renew your heart's posture, and empower you to lead with integrity and grace. Let's

Your Verse

Proverbs 16:18 - "Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 4:6 "But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says: 'God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble."
- Luke 18:14 "For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."







Devotional: Seeing Pride to Seek Grace

Spiritual pride can be sneaky. It often masquerades as genuine confidence or zeal for ministry, but beneath the surface, it elevates our own abilities above God's grace. Proverbs 16:18 warns us clearly that pride sets us on a path toward destruction. When we begin to trust in our skills, accolades, or status, we drift from the foundation of humility God desires in leaders.

Identifying pride is the first step to uprooting it. Reflect honestly: Are there moments when you attribute ministry success more to your gifts than God's provision? Do you find it hard to receive correction or admit mistakes? These are signs pride may be influencing your heart. *Don't be discouraged—God offers abundant grace to those who humbly seek Him.*

Remember James 4:6, which reminds us that God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble. This grace isn't about weakness but power under God's control. Our goal this week is to renew dependence on God's mercy and reject any subtle haughtiness that can undermine our calling.

Prayer for Today

Father, today I ask You to reveal any pride hidden in my heart, especially in my ministry. Help me to see myself as You see me—with grace and honest humility. Teach me to lean on Your strength, to value Your wisdom above my own, and to lead not for my glory but for Yours. *Fill me with humility, and guard me from the subtle snares of self-exaltation.* May my heart be quick to repent and eager to depend entirely on You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

















Your Verse

Philippians 2:3-4 - "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Peter 5:5 "All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because, 'God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble."
- Matthew 23:12 "For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."







Devotional: Leadership Rooted in Humility

Leadership in ministry is a sacred privilege but also a profound responsibility. Philippians 2:3–4 teaches us that true leadership flourishes not through selfish ambition but rooted in humility. This counters the common cultural idea that leaders must be self–promoting or assert dominance.

Valuing others above ourselves requires a daily choice to set aside ego and pride. When we focus on the needs and growth of those we serve rather than our own advancement, humility becomes a source of strength that widens our impact.

Peter's encouragement to clothe ourselves with humility reminds us that humility isn't passive or weak but an intentional way of living and leading. Scripture consistently shows that God favors the humble and opposes pride. When pride surfaces, it clouds our judgment and damages relationships. Conversely, humility opens the door for God's power to work through us.

Consider how adopting humility today might change your interactions, decisions, and prayers. This mindset doesn't mean downplaying your gifts but aligning them under God's purpose and grace.

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 15:5 "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing."
- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."







Day 3: O Dependence on God's Strength

Devotional: Power Perfected in Weakness

True humility recognizes our limitations and God's limitless power. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 12:9 show how embracing weakness invites Christ's strength into our lives and ministries. Instead of boasting in achievements or abilities, acknowledging our need for God's grace transforms us.

Ministry leaders often feel pressure to appear strong and capable, but Scripture reminds us that this pressure can create pride. We are called to depend on God's strength, trusting that in our weakness His power is revealed most vividly.

Jesus' analogy of the vine and branches illustrates this dependence beautifully. Apart from Him, we can accomplish nothing lasting or meaningful. When we partner with God in humility, bearing fruit becomes a natural byproduct.

Reflect on your current reliance on God. Are there areas where you struggle to trust His power over your own? Today, invite God to fill your weaknesses and refresh your spirit.

Day 4: 🖏 The Heart of Servant Leadership

Devotional: Leading by Serving Others

Spiritual pride often tempts leaders to grasp for status or control, but Jesus showed a radically different way. In Mark 10:43–45, He teaches that greatness in God's kingdom is found in humble service, even to the point of sacrifice.

Servant leadership requires a posture of humility and a heart focused on others' needs. Washing feet, serving those considered lowly or forgotten, and laying down our rights reflect the character of Christ. This counters the human tendency to seek elevation and recognition.

Paul's example of becoming a 'slave to everyone' highlights the intentional relinquishing of prideful entitlement for the sake of ministry success rooted in love and generosity.

Evaluate your own leadership: are you willing to serve in ways that diminish personal status in order to uplift others and glorify God?

Devotional: Purifying Your Ministry Motives

Motives reveal the true condition of the heart. Ministry, by its nature, offers opportunities to glorify God, but it also presents openings for pride to sneak in through misplaced intentions. 1 Corinthians 10:31 calls us to consider whether our actions honor God above all else.

Jesus warns about doing good deeds to be seen by others (Matthew 6:1), a common trap for leaders who may crave approval or status instead of seeking God's approval. Colossians reminds us to work wholeheartedly as if serving the Lord, not people.

Take time today to honestly examine your motives in ministry. Are you leading to exalt God or build personal reputation? Understanding these motivations is crucial for humility and alignment with God's purposes.

What motivations currently drive your ministry efforts?
How can you guard against seeking approval from people rather than God?
In what ways can you refocus your heart to glorify God in all you do?

Your Verse

Proverbs 9:9 - "Instruct the wise and they will be wiser still; teach the righteous and they will add to their learning."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:19–21 "Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry... get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent."
- Psalm 25:9 "He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them his way."







Day 6: " Cultivating a Teachable Spirit

Devotional: Embracing Growth Through Humility

One of the best defenses against spiritual pride is a teachable spirit. Wise men embrace correction and learn continually, recognizing they do not have all the answers. Proverbs 9:9 encourages the wise to add to their learning.

James reminds us to be quick to listen and slow to speak, which is vital for humility and growth. Anger or defensiveness often signal prideful resistance to learning. Psalm 25:9 promises that God guides the humble, teaching them His way.

Today, reflect on your openness to teaching and correction. Are you welcoming God's instruction through His Word, others, or life's circumstances? Cultivating a teachable heart allows humbling growth and continual dependence on God's wisdom rather than prideful self-reliance.

- Romans 5:3-4 "Suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope."







Devotional: Growth Through Trials and Humility

Ministry often brings testing and challenges that can tempt pride or discouragement. James encourages us to consider trials as opportunities for growth, producing maturity through endurance. This perspective requires humility—admitting we do not control every outcome but trust God's refining hand.

Peter calls us to humble ourselves under God's mighty hand, trusting He will lift us at the right time. Romans teaches how suffering shapes character and hope through perseverance.

Today, reflect on your response to ministry trials. Are you leaning on pride and self-reliance or humbly depending on God's refining work? Embrace the fires of testing as pathways to deeper humility and strength.

Your Verse

Galatians 6:4-5 - "Each one should test their own actions. Then they can take pride in themselves alone, without comparing themselves to someone else, for each one should carry their own load."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 10:12 "We do not dare to classify or compare ourselves with some who commend themselves. When they measure themselves by themselves and compare themselves with themselves, they are not wise."
- Romans 12:3 "Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment."







Day 8:
Breaking the Chains of Comparison

Devotional: Freedom from Comparison's Trap

Comparison is a subtle gateway to pride or discouragement in ministry.

Galatians reminds us to focus on our own actions and burdens without unhealthy comparisons. When we compare ourselves either to exalt ourselves or feel inferior, pride or insecurity take root.

Paul warns that comparing ourselves to others is unwise, leading to false pride or judgment. A sober assessment of ourselves—acknowledging strengths and weaknesses—is part of humility.

Today, examine your ministry relationships and self-evaluation. Are you comparing yourself in ways that feed pride or steal joy? Choose to carry your own load diligently and humbly.

- Proverbs 11:3 "The integrity of the upright guides them, but the unfaithful are destroyed by their duplicity."
- Ephesians 4:25 "Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbor."







Day 9: Thegrity in Words and Actions

Devotional: Walking Humbly with Integrity

Humility and integrity walk hand in hand. Psalm 15 describes the righteous person as one who acts justly and speaks truthfully. In ministry, integrity in words and deeds is essential to ward off pride and earn genuine trust.

Proverbs emphasizes integrity as a guide, while duplicity breeds destruction. Ephesians calls us to put aside falsehood and embrace truthful communication.

Reflect today on your integrity in ministry. Do your words align with your heart and actions? Are there areas where pride tempts compromise? Pray for consistency that honors God and builds trust.

Devotional: Faithful Sowing with Humble Trust

Ministry is a partnership where God is the ultimate cultivator. Paul reminds us that neither planting nor watering, symbols of leadership roles, is what brings growth; only God causes it.

This truth humbles leaders by shifting focus away from personal achievement toward faithful service in God's timing and power. John the Baptist's words show the heart posture—Christ's increase, our decrease.

Today, reflect on where you might be striving for visible results rather than trusting God's growth process. Embrace patience and faithfulness in sowing seeds for eternal purposes.

Ephesians 4:29 – "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 15:1 "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."
- James 3:13 "Who is wise and understanding among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom."







Day 11: 🚇 Humble Communication

Devotional: Words Reflecting Humble Wisdom

Words have tremendous power to build up or tear down, reflecting the condition of our hearts. Ephesians urges us to speak in ways that encourage and meet others' needs. Leaders must guard prideful or harsh speech that damages relationships and hinders ministry.

Proverbs emphasizes the power of gentle answers to defuse conflict, while James connects wisdom with humility demonstrated in actions and speech.

Consider your communication style: Do your words reflect humility and wisdom? Are you quick to speak or slow to listen? Strive to cultivate speech that honors God and builds community.

Galatians 1:10 – "Am I now trying to win the approval of human beings, or of God? Or am I trying to please people? If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a servant of Christ."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:17 "Whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."
- Matthew 6:33 "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."







Devotional: Obedience Over Approval

Leaders can easily fall into the trap of seeking human approval over God's.

Paul's honest question in Galatians shows the heart struggle between pleasing people and obeying Christ.

Colossians reminds us to do everything in Jesus' name with gratitude, not for applause. Matthew calls us to prioritize God's kingdom above all else.

Reflect honestly: Are your choices and leadership driven more by others' opinions or God's calling? Walking in obedience means relinquishing the desire for recognition and focusing on faithfulness to God alone.

- Philippians 2:15 "...so that you may become blameless and pure, children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation."
- Isaiah 60:1 "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you."







Devotional: Shining Light with Humble Hearts

As ministry leaders, we are called to be lights in a dark world. Jesus encourages us to let our good deeds shine to point others to God's glory, not our own.

Philippians describes this light as blameless and pure, standing out in a broken culture. Isaiah prophesies a radiant light reflecting God's glory.

Today, examine whether your actions reflect Christ's light humbly or draw attention to yourself. Genuine humility shines brightest when it turns glory fully to God.
