Devotional: Finding Comfort in God When Friends Drift Away

Feeling isolated when friends drift away is painful, but God does not leave us alone. Psalm 68:6 says God places the lonely into families, reminding us that He is the ultimate source of belonging.

When social circles change because of your marriage, loneliness may try to creep in. It can be tempting to despair or question your worth, but Deuteronomy 31:6 and Isaiah 41:10 assure us that God's steadfast presence is always with you both individually and as a couple.

Lean deeply into God today. Invite Him into your feelings of loneliness and uncertainty. Trust that He is cultivating a spiritual family around you—a church, a community, and most profoundly, your spouse.

Devotional: Trusting God to Overcome Insecurity in Marriage
