Day 1: Called to Be Salt

Your Verse

Matthew 5:13 - "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 4:6 "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone."
- Mark 9:50 "Salt is good, but if it loses its saltiness, how can you make it salty again? Have salt among yourselves, and be at peace with each other."







Day 1: Called to Be Salt

Devotional: The Power and Purpose of Salt

Being salt means having influence that preserves and enhances. Jesus uses the metaphor of salt to illustrate how His followers impact the world around them. Salt's qualities are invaluable—it adds flavor, acts as a preservative, and even has healing properties. When Jesus calls us "the salt of the earth," He is reminding us of our purpose: to preserve goodness, add value, and bring healing where there is brokenness.

However, Jesus also warns about salt losing its saltiness. This is a sobering reminder that our influence isn't automatic or permanent. If we become complacent, disconnected from Christ, or compromised by worldly pressures, our effectiveness diminishes. We risk becoming tasteless and ineffective in our role as kingdom influencers.

Today, reflect on the vitality of your faith and how it impacts those around you. Are you preserving godly values and bringing spiritual flavor to your relationships and environments? Or is there an area of your life where you feel your saltiness is fading? Ask God to restore your passion and influence, so your role as salt remains strong and unmistakable.

Remember, being salt isn't about blending in but standing firm with distinctive character that draws others to Christ.

Devotional: Living Boldly as Light

Light exposes, guides, and comforts in the darkest places. Jesus declares that we are the light of the world—and as such, we must accept the visibility and responsibility this entails. Just as a city on a hill can be seen from miles away, our lives are on display. We cannot hide the reality of who we are.

Living as light means being a guide to those around us, showing the way to Jesus and illuminating truth in a confusing world. It requires courage, because light exposes what is hidden, including sin and brokenness. But this exposure leads to healing and transformation.

Take time today to consider how openly your life reflects Christ. Are you willingly visible, letting your light shine, or do you sometimes hide your faith to avoid discomfort? Embracing your identity as light means embracing both influence and accountability.

By choosing to live transparently, you invite God's presence into your circumstances and provide hope to those who stumble in darkness. You become a beacon that points others to salvation and peace.

- 1 Peter 2:9 "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession... that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."







Devotional: Removing Barriers to Shine Bright

Jesus teaches that light should never be hidden but placed where all can see its illuminating power. This reminds us that our faith and influence are not meant to be private or obscured. Instead, we have a responsibility to actively live out our calling in ways that impact everyone around us.

In a world filled with spiritual darkness—marked by pain, injustice, and confusion—our influence as Christ's followers is critical. We are called to be that lamp on a stand, shining truth and hope for everyone to see. This public witness challenges cultural norms and offers an alternative to worldly values.

Consider how you may be unintentionally hiding your light in fear, compromise, or comfort. What excuses or barriers prevent you from fully embracing your role as a visible influencer for God's kingdom?

Today, commit to removing these barriers. Pursue holiness and purity, allowing your life to radiate God's glory in a generation desperately in need of His love and truth. Your distinctiveness as a child of God is meant to draw others out of darkness.
