#### Introduction

The Bible is filled with stories of God's interaction with His people, often through surprising and profound signs. One such story is about Saul, the first king of Israel, who experienced a remarkable and misunderstood sign through his encounter with prophets. This narrative invites us to explore how God's ways can differ from our expectations and teaches us about obedience, humility, and the unfolding of His divine purpose.

In 1 Samuel 10, we read about Saul being anointed as king and then meeting a group of prophets who begin prophesying unexpectedly. This event was a powerful confirmation of God's choice, but its meaning was not immediately clear to Saul or those around him. It challenges us to consider how God communicates with us and how we respond to His guidance, especially when it comes in unfamiliar forms.

Through this 7-day study plan, we will dive deeper into the narrative of Saul among the prophets, reflecting on God's signs, human misunderstanding, and the transformation that occurs when we submit to God's will. Each day will provide Scripture readings, reflections, and prompts to help you engage with the text personally and apply its lessons to your own spiritual journey. Together, we will learn to recognize God's voice and respond with faith and obedience, even when His plan is not fully understood.

















#### Your Verse

1 Samuel 10:1 - "Then Samuel took a flask of oil and poured it on Saul's head and kissed him, saying, 'Has not the LORD anointed you ruler over his inheritance?""

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Jeremiah 1:5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."
- Psalm 23:1 "The LORD is my shepherd, I lack nothing."







#### Devotional: Embracing God's Unexpected Call

Saul's journey began with a sacred anointing. Samuel anointed him, marking God's choice for leadership over Israel. This ceremony was both an honor and a heavy responsibility, highlighting that God's plans often involve calling ordinary people to extraordinary purposes.

Consider how God chooses not by worldly standards but by His divine wisdom. Saul, a simple man from the tribe of Benjamin, was elevated to kingship—not because of his stature or power but by God's sovereign decision. This moment reminds us to trust God's choices, even when we don't fully understand His criteria.

Similarly, God calls each of us to unique roles in His kingdom. Reflect on your own calling—how might God be inviting you to step into a purpose greater than yourself? Like Saul, your journey may start with an unexpected call that sets you on a path of transformation and service.

#### Your Verse

1 Samuel 10:5 – "Then you will go to Gibeah of God, where there is a Philistine outpost. As you approach the town, you will meet a procession of prophets coming down from the high place with lyres, timbrels, pipes and harps being played before them, and they will be prophesying."

#### Supporting Scriptures

- Ezekiel 2:3 "Son of man, I am sending you to the Israelites, to a rebellious nation that has rebelled against me; they and their ancestors have been in revolt against me to this very day."
- Acts 2:17 "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy..."

#### Devotional: Recognizing God's Voice Among Prophets

**The prophets' appearance was a divine sign.** As Saul journeyed to Gibeah, he encountered a procession of prophets prophesying with music and spiritual energy. This scene was not just ceremonial; it was a manifestation of God's Spirit moving powerfully in the people.

In biblical times, prophecy was often a sign of God's presence and guidance. For Saul, this encounter confirmed his new status and connected him with God's ongoing work through His prophets. Yet, it was also unexpected, showing that God's methods do not always align with human anticipation.

Today, God still communicates with us through His Spirit, sometimes through the voices of others, sometimes through the quiet moments of our hearts. Reflect on how you perceive God's voice and how open you are to His ways of speaking, especially when they surprise you.

#### Your Verse

1 Samuel 10:10 – "When they came there to the hill, a group of prophets met him, and the Spirit of God came powerfully upon him, and he joined in their prophesying."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Acts 1:8 "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses..."
- 2 Corinthians 3:18 "...we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory..."







# Devotional: Empowered and Transformed by the Spirit

Saul's transformation was immediate and profound. The Spirit of God came powerfully upon him, enabling him to join the prophets in their proclamation. This moment highlights the essential role the Holy Spirit plays in empowering and transforming us to fulfill God's purposes.

God doesn't just call us—He equips us through His Spirit. Saul's prophesying symbolized a shift from uncertainty to empowerment. It serves as a reminder that the presence of God within us can radically change our abilities and our destiny.

Consider how the Holy Spirit is working in your life. Are you allowing God's transformative power to move through you, enabling you to speak, act, and live according to His will? Let this encouragement inspire you to seek deeper intimacy with the Spirit.

- John 1:11 "He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him."
- Psalm 27:14 "Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart and wait for the LORD."







#### Devotional: Trusting God Amid Misunderstanding

Despite the clear evidence of God's hand, Saul faced skepticism and rejection. Some people doubted God's chosen leader, unable to see beyond their own perceptions. This teaches us about how human misunderstanding can challenge God's intentions and delay our acceptance of His plans.

Saul's silence in the face of rejection demonstrates humility and trust in God's timing. Often, God's signs are misunderstood or dismissed, creating moments of discouragement. However, these challenges are opportunities to deepen our reliance on God rather than public approval.

Reflect on occasions when you felt misunderstood or doubted while following God's guidance. How can this story encourage you to remain faithful and patient, trusting God's ultimate plan?

1 Samuel 10:24 – "Then Samuel brought all the tribes of Israel near, and the tribe of Benjamin was taken by lot. He brought forward the tribe of Benjamin, clan by clan, and Matri was taken. Then he brought forward the family of Matri, clan by clan, and Saul son of Kish was taken."

#### Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 8:28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him..."
- Isaiah 55:8 "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD.







#### Devotional: Trusting in God's Sovereign Plan

God's plan for Saul's leadership was deliberate and sovereign. The process of choosing Saul by lot highlights God's control over the selection and reminds us that His purposes prevail regardless of human confusion or resistance.

Sometimes we question why God's choices seem unconventional or puzzling. However, this passage encourages trust in His wisdom and the assurance that He is at work in all circumstances. Whether we understand the details or not, God's purposes are being fulfilled.

Consider areas in your life where God's plan feels unclear or unexpected. Take comfort in knowing He works all things for good and invites us to lean into His higher perspective.

2.	Why is it important to trust God's ways even when they differ from ours?
3.	In what areas might you need to surrender to God's sovereign plan?

3.	Pray for submission to God's sovereign will in your life.







#### Prayer for Today

**Father God,** remind me that Your ways are higher than mine. Help me to trust Your sovereign plan, even when I do not understand it. Teach me to surrender my doubts and fears, knowing You work for my good and Your glory. Lead me to rest in Your perfect control and faithful love. *Amen.* 



















#### Your Verse

1 Samuel 10:8 - "Go down ahead of me to Gilgal. I will surely come down to you to sacrifice burnt offerings and fellowship offerings, but you must wait seven days until I come to you and tell you what you shall do."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Deuteronomy 5:33 "Walk in obedience to all that the LORD your God has commanded you..."
- Psalm 119:105 "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."







#### Devotional: The Power of Patient Obedience

**Obedience was a key part of Saul's journey.** He was instructed to wait patiently for Samuel's guidance, demonstrating the importance of trusting and obeying God's timing and commands.

Obedience often requires waiting and faithfulness even when answers or directions are not immediately clear. Saul's story prompts us to reflect on our own willingness to follow God's instructions faithfully without rushing or questioning prematurely.

Let us embrace obedience as a vital act of worship and trust. By walking according to God's word, we align ourselves with His will and experience the blessings of His guidance.
