Day 1: Created with Purpose and Beauty

Your Verse

Psalm 139:13-14 - "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well."

Supporting Scriptures

Day 1: W Created with Purpose and Beauty

Devotional: Fearfully and Wonderfully Made by God

Devotional: Embracing God's Strength Over Self-Doubt

Body image struggles often focus on external looks, but Proverbs 31:25 challenges us to focus on inner strength and dignity. This verse portrays a woman who is clothed with strength — a strength that arises not from outward appearance, but from character and God's empowering presence.

It's easy to feel weak or discouraged when battling negative thoughts about your body. Yet God promises in Isaiah 40:29 that He gives strength to the weary and power to the weak. When your confidence feels shaken, lean into His power rather than your own.
