Devotional: God's Word Lights Our Daily Path

Psalm 119:105 highlights the profound role God's Word plays in guiding our lives. When we seek God's kingdom first, we acknowledge that His instructions and promises provide clarity amid uncertainty. Just as a lamp illuminates a dark path, God's Word reveals the steps we should take each day, keeping us on the path of righteousness.

Consider the ways you navigate daily decisions. Are you relying on worldly wisdom, or do you let Scripture illuminate your way? The psalmist's deep love for God's commands stems from personal experience—the truth of God's Word has consistently proven reliable and life-giving. This chapter commands intentional reading and meditation to internalize God's principles.

Devotional: Drawing Strength from God's Promises

Life's challenges can leave our souls tired and weary, but Psalm 119 shows us where true strength resides. The psalmist openly acknowledges his sorrow yet turns to God's Word for renewal and encouragement. Our modern lives are no different—when difficulties press in, God's promises lift us up and offer renewed hope.

Seeking God's kingdom first in times of fatigue means resting in His faithfulness. The strength we find in God's commands isn't just physical but deeply spiritual—a resilience to stand firm through trials. Scripture reminds us that "The joy of the Lord is your strength" (*Nehemiah 8:10*), and this joy comes from knowing God's truth and presence.

When you feel drained or overwhelmed, lean into God's Word. Let it speak courage and peace into your heart. Meditate on passages that remind you of God's power and love. Remember, seeking the kingdom is not about your strength alone but about trusting the One who empowers you.

1.	Describe a season when God's Word was your source of strength.

3.	Write a prayer asking God to renew your strength through His Word.

Day 3: B Living by God's Truth Daily

Devotional: Hiding God's Word in Our Hearts

To seek God's kingdom first requires more than hearing God's Word—it requires embedding it deeply in our hearts and living it out. Psalm 119:11 reveals the psalmist's commitment to hiding God's Word within as a guard against sin. This internalization fosters a heart sensitive to God's presence and a life marked by obedience.

When God's truth is living within us, it shapes our thoughts, behaviors, and decisions. Jesus taught His followers that remaining in Him and His words remaining in them results in answered prayers (*John 15:7*). This demonstrates the power of a heart continually nourished by Scripture.

Obedience to God's Word is the evidence of truly seeking His kingdom. It is here that transformation occurs—where the Word moves from page to practice. Today's challenge is to reflect on how fully God's Word lives in your heart and influences your daily choices.
