#### Devotional: Trusting God's Word to Guide Our Steps

Psalm 119:105 paints a vivid picture of God's Word as a guiding light. Imagine walking through a dark forest without a flashlight—each step uncertain, fraught with fear. This is how life can feel when we rely solely on our own wisdom. But God offers us His Word like a lamp to illuminate our path. It doesn't just provide some vague direction; it lights every step and decision, making the path clear and safe.

In practical terms, this means turning to Scripture when faced with choices—big or small. It means trusting that God's instructions are perfect and reliable. Even when the way forward seems confusing, God's Word brings clarity, helping us discern His will.

- Job 28:28 "And he said to the human race, 'The fear of the Lord—that is wisdom, and to shun evil is understanding."







#### Devotional: Foundation of True Wisdom

God's wisdom begins not with knowledge or cleverness but with reverence for Him. The fear of the Lord is not about being afraid but about a deep respect and awe for God's holiness, power, and authority. This reverence is the foundation upon which true wisdom and understanding rest.

When we recognize who God is and His rightful place in our lives, we naturally desire to follow His ways. This posture brings clarity when faced with decisions because it shifts our focus from self to God. We begin to desire His best and see that choosing according to His Word aligns us with ultimate goodness and truth.

Psalm 111:10 confirms that those who follow God's precepts walk in understanding. Fear of God isn't a burden but a starting point that opens our hearts to His teaching.

Today, ask yourself if your pursuit of wisdom begins with this reverence. Without it, knowledge can become empty, but with it, every choice is aligned with the heart of God.

Day 3: A Trusting God's Direction Over Our Plans

#### Your Verse

Proverbs 16:9 – "In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps."

Day 3: A Trusting God's Direction Over Our Plans

#### Devotional: Surrendering Our Plans to God's Purpose

We naturally make plans and set goals, but true wisdom is recognizing that God ultimately directs our steps. Proverbs 16:9 reminds us that while we plan, the Lord holds the final authority to guide our lives. This truth invites us into a posture of humility and trust.

- Colossians 3:16 "Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom."







#### Devotional: Living Rooted in God's Wisdom

God's Word is not only illuminating but nourishing and practical. Psalm 1 describes the person who delights in God's instruction and meditates day and night as a tree firmly rooted by streams of water. This imagery shows that daily engagement with Scripture brings life, stability, and fruitfulness.

The Bible contains wisdom for every aspect of life—how to relate to others, how to handle conflict, how to grow in character, and how to live in a way that pleases God. As 2 Timothy 3:16–17 says, Scripture equips us for every good work by teaching, correcting, and training us.

Delighting in God's Word means more than studying occasionally; it requires regular meditation and a heart eager to apply what is learned. When we let God's message dwell richly among us, it shapes our attitudes, decisions, and relationships.

Consider your current habits—how deeply do you engage with Scripture, and how does it influence your daily choices?

- Matthew 7:24–25 "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock."







#### Devotional: Heavenly Wisdom Shapes Our Choices

Not all wisdom is equal. The wisdom God provides is pure and produces peace, mercy, and good fruit. James 3:17 describes heavenly wisdom with qualities that transform how we make decisions. It is considerate of others, submissive to God's will, impartial, and sincere.

This wisdom protects us and builds a strong foundation, like the wise builder who constructs his home on a rock (Matthew 7:24–25). Such a foundation withstands trials and difficulties because it is rooted in God's truth.

Our choices reflect what kind of wisdom we follow. When we pursue God's wisdom, our decisions foster peace in relationships, show mercy, and lead to actions that bless others. Earthly wisdom often prioritizes selfish gain or immediate benefits, but God's wisdom looks at the bigger picture and eternal good.

Today, examine your decision-making process. Are you seeking and applying God's wisdom that transforms, or relying on worldly perspectives?

3.	Where can you invite more submission to God's guidance in your decisions?
