Devotional: Embrace Humility to Receive Wisdom

Wise counsel is essential for success and growth. Proverbs 15:22 highlights how plans can fail without it—but with many advisers, success becomes possible. God designed us for relationship, including the counsel we receive from others as part of His wisdom in our lives.

Often, pride or fear prevents us from seeking advice. Yet, the Bible encourages us to humble ourselves and be open to guidance. Even Solomon, the wisest man, recognized the need for wisdom beyond himself and urged others to pursue it.

- Proverbs 3:5-6 Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.







Devotional: Let Scripture Illuminate Your Path

While human advice is valuable, the Bible remains the ultimate source of counsel for every situation. Psalm 119:105 beautifully describes God's Word as a lamp and light guiding us through life's uncertainties. Unlike human wisdom, God's guidance never fails or misleads.

2 Timothy reminds us that Scripture equips us for every aspect of living — from teaching and correction to training in righteousness. When we immerse ourselves in God's Word, we receive clear instructions that shape our hearts and minds according to His will.

When facing tough decisions, trusting in God rather than our limited understanding brings peace and clarity. We can acknowledge Him in all our ways, confident that He will direct our paths. This requires faith and surrender, yet God's promises hold firm.

Today, commit to devoting time to prayerfully reading and applying Scripture as the foundation of your counsel. Let God's Word illuminate your steps and anchor your choices.

Devotional: Foster Relationships That Sharpen Faith

God designed us to live in community, where wise counsel thrives through relationships. Ecclesiastes reminds us that companionship increases our strength and wisdom. When we walk life's paths alongside trusted friends or mentors, we benefit from mutual support and accountability.

Proverbs compares this to iron sharpening iron, symbolizing how godly friendships refine our character and decisions. Similarly, Hebrews encourages believers to meet regularly, encouraging love and good deeds.

Engaging with wise advisors safeguards our hearts and encourages spiritual growth. Their perspectives help us see blind spots and make godly choices grounded in the Bible.

Today, evaluate the relationships you have. Are there trustworthy, wise believers you can turn to for counsel? If not, seek opportunities to develop these godly connections.
