Colossians 4:6 - "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 1 Peter 3:15 "But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have."
- Ephesians 4:15 "Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ."







#### Devotional: Speak Truth with Grace and Kindness

Starting with compassion is essential when sharing Jesus with your grandchildren. Paul instructs believers in Colossians 4:6 not just to speak truth, but to do so "full of grace, seasoned with salt." This means that how we present the Gospel is as important as the message itself. Grace allows us to speak kindly, while salt gives flavor—making our words engaging, preserving the message from decay, and pointing to life.

Compassion opens hearts, breaking down barriers that skepticism or hurt might have built over time. It reminds us not to be harsh or argumentative but gentle, mirroring Christ's approach. This foundation helps ensure that truth doesn't come across as condemnation but as hope.

#### Devotional: The Power of Listening First

**Sharing Jesus begins with listening.** James 1:19 reminds us to be quick to listen and slow to speak. This principle is vital when engaging with grandchildren who may have doubts, questions, or even resistance toward faith.

Listening conveys respect and shows you value their thoughts and feelings. When grandchildren feel heard, walls of defensiveness come down, opening the way for meaningful dialogue. Sometimes the best witness is silent presence, allowing space for the Holy Spirit to work internally.

#### Devotional: Gentle Scripture Sharing Builds Bridges

Scripture is our most powerful tool, but the way we share it matters greatly. 2 Timothy 2:24–25 teaches us to be kind and gentle even when correcting or teaching. This approach helps keep conversations about faith constructive rather than combative.
