loud proclamations, but through the quiet power of kindness, integrity, and courage.

















#### Your Verse

Ephesians 4:32 - Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Colossians 3:12 Therefore, as God's chosen people, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.
- Matthew 5:16 In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.







#### Devotional: Kindness: The Light That Draws Others In

Kindness has the power to open hearts and break down barriers. At school, small acts of kindness can make a huge difference, whether it's offering a smile to someone sitting alone, helping a classmate with homework, or speaking encouraging words. The Bible teaches us in Ephesians 4:32 to be kind and compassionate, reminding us that God's forgiveness is the foundation of the kindness we offer others.

Remember, kindness reflects God's nature and is not about receiving recognition but about showing His love. # Devotional: Integrity: Standing Firm When No One's Watching

Integrity means living honestly and morally, even when nobody is looking. At school, it's easy to be tempted to cheat, gossip, or cut corners to fit in or get ahead. But Proverbs 10:9 encourages us to walk in integrity, promising security and protection when we do so. This kind of character builds trust and honors God.

Living with integrity may require courage, especially when peer pressure is strong. Psalm 25:21 reminds us that integrity protects us, and our deepest hope is in the Lord. When you make choices based on God's standards instead of social approval, you reflect a distinct light that shows others there is another way.

Think about your daily choices at school. Are your actions consistent with your faith? Are there moments you've given in to pressure or compromised your values? God's grace is always there to help you start fresh and walk boldly in truth. Your integrity will inspire respect and demonstrate the difference Christ makes in your life.

# Devotional: Courage to Shine Without Fear or Preachiness

Being a teen who lives for Christ at school often means standing out — and that can feel scary. You might worry about being teased, rejected, or misunderstood. But God's Word gives us a powerful command in Joshua 1:9 to be strong and courageous because He is always with us.

1 Timothy 4:12 encourages young believers like you to set an example through your speech, conduct, love, faith, and purity. You don't need to be loud or preachy to show the difference your faith makes — your life itself can be a powerful testimony. Philippians 1:27 reminds us to conduct ourselves worthily of the gospel no matter the circumstances.

What does courage look like for you at school? It might mean choosing not to join in gossip, standing up for someone being bullied, or simply being yourself even when your friends don't understand your faith. Remember, God promises His presence wherever you go. This gives you strength to be that light, reflecting Jesus in all you do without feeling the need to push others away with words.
