Day 1: 6 Embracing the Call to Preach

#### Devotional: Trusting God's Call Beyond Your Limits

Answering God's call is the first step in sermon preparation. Like Timothy, we are instructed not just to preach but to be ready at all times. This readiness isn't about having a perfect sermon all the time but about being prepared in our hearts and minds under the Spirit's guidance.

# Devotional: Organizing Sermons to Honor God and Listeners

Purposeful structure helps your listeners follow the flow of God's truth. It also aids your confidence as a preacher, knowing each point builds towards your overall message.

Begin with prayerfully determined goals: What should the hearers believe, feel, and do after your sermon? Then outline an introduction, main points, illustrations, and a conclusion that ties everything together.

Remember to commit your preparation plans to the Lord, trusting Him to establish your work. Allow flexibility for the Spirit to adjust your structure during delivery, but hold to clarity and order.

Today reflect on how you balance bold authority in God's Word with humble dependence on Him. The Spirit helps us speak confidently without arrogance, caring more about God's glory than our approval.
