# Spiritual Confidence Without Arrogance



Explore how biblical men live confidently yet humbly, distinguishing godly confidence from pride through Scripture and reflection.





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#### Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day journey focusing on what it means for men to walk with spiritual confidence that is rooted in humility and guided by Scripture. In a world that often values strength and assertiveness, many men struggle to differentiate between genuine, God-given confidence and the pitfalls of arrogance or pride. This study is designed to help you understand that true confidence comes from a relationship with God and a heart that embraces humility.

Throughout these seven days, we will explore biblical examples and teachings that illuminate how men can be bold and courageous without becoming prideful. The Bible encourages men to be strong and courageous, but always with an awareness of their dependence on God's grace and power. Spiritual confidence is not about self-glorification; it's about trusting God's promises and walking obediently in His will, while serving others with love and respect.

Each day will provide a key passage to meditate upon, accompanied by supporting verses that reinforce the theme. The devotionals will encourage reflection on the heart attitudes behind confidence, and you'll be challenged to apply these truths personally. You'll also be given journaling prompts to deepen your engagement and prayers to connect you to God's strength and wisdom.







**Prepare to be transformed,** not by striving in your own strength but by embracing the humble boldness that God desires. May this study help you grow into a man who confidently walks by faith, balanced by humility, becoming a reflection of Christ's character in every part of your life.















#### Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5-6 - "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 34:4 "I sought the LORD, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears."
- 2 Timothy 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."







#### Devotional: Trust God Fully for True Confidence

On the journey of spiritual confidence, **the foundation is trust in God alone**. Proverbs 3:5–6 challenges us to lean entirely on the Lord rather than our own limited perspective. A man with godly confidence understands his dependence on God's wisdom and guidance in every choice and circumstance.

Many times, pride creeps in when we start to trust our skills, achievements, or intelligence more than God. This leads to arrogance and causes relationships to suffer. But when we *seek the Lord* sincerely, as Psalm 34:4 reminds us, we receive deliverance from fear and uncertainty, which becomes the cornerstone of true confidence.

It's also important to recognize that the Spirit God gives us empowers us to walk boldly with love and self-control, not boasting or harshness (2 Timothy 1:7). Today, reflect on how your confidence is built and whether your trust is placed in God's strength or your own.

3.	What does leaning on God look like practically in your daily decisions?

2.	Reflect on how fear has influenced your actions or attitudes lately.
3.	List ways you can remind yourself daily to trust God more fully.







#### **Prayer for Today**

**Lord,** help me to place my full trust in You, not in my own understanding or strength. Teach me to lean on Your guidance in all areas of my life. Please replace any pride or arrogance with humility and give me the boldness that comes from Your Spirit. May my confidence be a reflection of my faith in You alone. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*















#### Your Verse

James 4:6 - "But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says: 'God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble.'"

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Philippians 2:3 "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves."
- 1 Peter 5:5 "All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because, 'God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble.""







#### Devotional: Grace Grows Where Humility Lives

Confidence without humility is arrogance; humility without confidence can lead to timidity. James 4:6 teaches us that God resists the proud but gives grace to those who are humble. For a man of God, humility is not weakness but the soil in which genuine boldness grows.

Humility means recognizing our value and gifts as God's workmanship while acknowledging our need for Him and others. Philippians 2:3 encourages us to value others above ourselves, which keeps pride at bay and encourages us to walk boldly, serving and loving rather than competing or boasting.

Peter calls us to 'clothe ourselves with humility' as a daily practice. This divine favor granted to the humble unleashes the kind of boldness that speaks truth in love, stands firm in trials, and acts courageously without self-glory.

Today, consider how your pride might be holding back your spiritual growth and how embracing humility can release God's grace for confident living.

Day 3: XX Courage in Weakness

#### Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 27:1 "The LORD is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?"
- Ephesians 6:10 "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power."







Day 3: X Courage in Weakness

#### Devotional: Power Perfected in Our Weakness

The pursuit of spiritual confidence requires a deep understanding of our own weaknesses. Paul's declaration in 2 Corinthians shows a powerful paradox: God's power shines brightest in our moments of weakness. Thus, a humble man embraces his limitations, knowing that they provide space for Christ's strength to manifest.

Courage does not mean invulnerability; it means facing challenges with trust in God's sufficiency. Psalm 27:1 boldly states that when the Lord is our light and salvation, fear loses its grip. This kind of courage is not boastful but rooted in dependence.

As Ephesians encourages, our strength comes from the Lord's mighty power. When we accept this truth, spiritual confidence becomes a testimony of God's work within us rather than our own bravery. Reflect on how embracing your weaknesses can cultivate a courageous and humble faith.

# Devotional: Confidence Shown Through Serving Others

True spiritual confidence expresses itself most clearly in a man's willingness to serve others humbly. Jesus sets the ultimate example of strength under control by choosing to serve rather than be served.

Mark 10:43–45 teaches us that greatness in God's kingdom is measured by a heart of service. This humility does not diminish confidence; it renounces selfish ambition and embraces leadership through love. Such confidence is secure enough not to seek recognition but desires to build others up.

Galatians highlights serving one another with humility and love—traits that keep pride in check and foster authentic community. Philippians encourages adopting Christ's mindset, humble and self-giving, showing that spiritual boldness often looks like quiet, consistent service.

Reflect today on how your confidence can be expressed through serving others and seeking their good above your own.

- Colossians 4:6 "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt..."







#### Devotional: Bold Truth Spoken with Gentle Love

Spiritual confidence also means having the courage to speak truth, but always tempered by love. Ephesians 4:15 reminds us that maturity in our faith comes from speaking the truth lovingly, which helps build up the body of Christ.

Proverbs values honest rebuke over silent affection, showing that boldness sometimes means gently confronting others for their good. Yet, this boldness must be balanced with grace; as Colossians encourages, our words should be gracious and thoughtful.

Men who speak truth without love risk alienation and pride, while those lacking confidence may avoid necessary conversations. The balance of humility and boldness equips us to encourage, correct, and build relationships that honor God.

Reflect today on how you communicate—are you bold yet loving? How can you grow in this vital aspect of confident manhood?







## Reflect and Apply

1.	When have you struggled to balance truth and love in your words?
2.	How does humility impact the way you speak to others?
3.	What truths might you need to speak courageously yet lovingly?







## **Journaling Prompts**

1.	Write about a time you spoke the truth in love and its outcome.
2.	Reflect on conversations you have avoided and consider why.
	Plan how to improve your communication with gentleness and confidence.







#### Prayer for Today

**Lord,** grant me the grace to speak truth with love and humility. Help me to build others up through my words and to have courage when difficult conversations arise. Teach me to season my speech with Your wisdom and kindness, reflecting Your character. *Amen.* 















#### Your Verse

James 1:9-10 - "Believers in humble circumstances ought to take pride in their high position. But the rich should take pride in their humiliation—since they will pass away like a wild flower."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Proverbs 16:18 "Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall."
- Ecclesiastes 7:8 "The end of a matter is better than its beginning..."







#### Devotional: Walk Humbly Through Every Season

Men walk a fine line between pride and humility, especially when dealing with success and failure. James reminds us that both circumstances require humility: the humble should rejoice in their status in Christ, and the prosperous should remember life's fleeting nature.

Success can easily inflate ego, causing pride that leads to downfall (Proverbs 16:18). Conversely, failure often humbles us but can also discourage if not viewed rightly. Ecclesiastes highlights the value of perseverance and perspective over time.

A man committed to godly confidence learns to celebrate victories without arrogance and face setbacks without despair. This balance requires ongoing humility — recognizing that every season is under God's sovereignty and serves His purpose.

Reflect on your responses to both success and failure. Do they reflect a heart aligned with God's wisdom?

Micah 6:8 - "He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Joshua 1:9 "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."
- Romans 12:3 "Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment..."







# Devotional: Boldness and Humility: The Godly Balance

As we conclude this study, Micah 6:8 sums up the heart of spiritual confidence without arrogance: act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with God. This call requires both boldness and humility — to stand firm in God's truth and to live compassionately dependent on Him.

Joshua's encouragement reminds us that courage is not absence of fear but confidence in God's presence. Romans warns against inflated self-opinion, calling for sober judgment—a humble but truthful view of ourselves in light of God's grace.

Being a man of God means leading with integrity, loving as Christ loved, and walking humbly day by day. It requires spiritual maturity that balances strength and gentleness, confidence and humility.

Today, commit to living out these truths, fostering a confident spirit empowered by God's love and marked by humility in every interaction.
