#### Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - 'But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me.'

- Psalm 34:18 'The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.'
- Isaiah 40:29 'He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.'







Day 1: "Finding Strength in Weakness

#### Devotional: God's Power in Our Weakness

Day 2: B Leading with Compassion from the Heart

#### Devotional: Clothed in Compassion Amidst Grief

Colossians 3:12 instructs us to clothe ourselves with compassion, humility, and patience—qualities that become especially meaningful when our own hearts bear sorrow. This day invites leaders to consider how personal grief can heighten empathy toward others who suffer.

#### Devotional: Bold Leadership in Sorrow

Leadership in grief requires boldness rooted in God's promise. Joshua 1:9 is a timeless exhortation to be strong and courageous. While your heart may ache, God commands you not to be afraid or discouraged because He is with you every step of the way.

Psalm 23:4 beautifully echoes this truth—walking through dark valleys doesn't mean walking alone. God's presence dispels fear and anchors your courage, even when your emotions feel fragile. This awareness provides the foundation to lead steadily, inspiring others amid uncertainty.
