#### Devotional: Identifying Poverty's Spiritual Battles

#### Devotional: Faith-Filled Giving Defeats Poverty's Grip

Day 5: Battling Thoughts With Kingdom Truth

#### Devotional: Claiming Victory Over Negative Thoughts
