Devotional: Recognizing the True Enemy in Our Struggles

Devotional: Praying with the Authority Christ Has Given

Jesus has already given believers authority over spiritual forces. When praying for a prodigal child, intercession should never be timid but bold and confident, drawing upon this divine authority. The enemy's hold on our loved ones can feel strong, but through Christ, we have power to break spiritual chains.

Claiming this authority means speaking in Jesus' name with faith, resisting lies, and commanding the enemy to leave. It's vital to remember that our authority comes not from our own ability but through our relationship with Christ. When you pray today, declare this truth with power and expectation, trusting that the battle is already won in Jesus.

Bold prayer backed by Jesus' authority shifts heavenly dynamics and releases freedom for your prodigal.

Devotional: Praying According to the Spirit's Guidance

Spiritual warfare intercession is empowered by the Holy Spirit's presence and guidance. When our words falter or our understanding is limited, the Spirit intercedes for us, praying the perfect prayers that align with God's will.

Inviting the Holy Spirit into your prayer life brings fresh boldness, insight, and peace amidst struggle. It also fuels love and perseverance as you minister in the Spirit rather than the flesh. For a parent of a prodigal, this means leaning into sensitivity for what the Spirit reveals, whether in Scripture, feelings, or whisperings of encouragement.

Let the Spirit empower your prayers today. Trust His lead and watch how He opens doors that human effort cannot.
