# Devotional: Prayer: Your Spiritual Strength and Weapon

Remember, your prayers are not wasted. The Bible assures us that the prayers of the righteous have great power and bring about change (James 5:16). Today, commit to deepening your prayer life for your household, asking God to soften hearts and reveal His love.
