- Psalm 25:21 "May integrity and uprightness protect me, because my hope, LORD, is in you."







Day 1: V Standing Firm With Integrity

Devotional: Build Your Foundation on Integrity

Integrity is the foundation for standing up to truth respectfully in your career. Ephesians 6:14 calls believers to "stand firm" wearing truth as a belt and righteousness as a breastplate—an image that reminds us to be steadfast and protected by God's standards. *Integrity means living honestly and consistently, without compromise.*

- Proverbs 15:1 "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."







Devotional: Combine Honesty with Grace

Truth without love can alienate, but truth spoken in love builds bridges.

Ephesians 4:15 calls us to maturity by combining honesty with kindness. In the workplace, how you say something often matters as much as what you say. If you want to stand up for truth respectfully, your words must be seasoned with grace and humility.

Colossians 4:6 reminds us to fill our conversations with grace—this means listening well, choosing words carefully, and striving to understand others' perspectives. Proverbs 15:1 confirms that a gentle tone can defuse potential conflict.

Standing for truth respectfully means guarding your attitude as much as your message. When you approach conversations with compassion and patience, you create a safe environment for dialogue rather than division. Let love be the filter through which every truth travels today.
