Day 1: Toundations of True Wisdom

Devotional: The Starting Point: Reverence for God

Devotional: Pursuing God's Higher Justice

When legal systems fall short or seem corrupt, God calls us to a higher justice—one rooted in compassion and righteousness. Isaiah 1:17 charges believers to *learn to do right, seek justice, and defend the oppressed*. This is not passive but active living. Our faith demands bold engagement in fighting injustice wherever it arises, not only by obeying laws but by discerning where laws themselves fail and responding accordingly.

God's justice is not blind obedience but a passionate quest for right. Micah reminds us that justice is intertwined with mercy and humility. Devotional: Integrity Shields the Righteous


Prayer for Today
