Your Verse

Devotional: Rooted Identity Beyond Relationship Status

In singleness, identity can sometimes feel uncertain, but your true identity is secure in Christ alone. You are fearfully and wonderfully made, chosen, and loved deeply by God. The enemy often tries to confuse or devalue singles, but your worth is anchored in what Christ has done.
