# Stephen's Final Sermon and Martyrdom



Explore the faith, courage, and grace of Stephen as he preaches boldly and embraces martyrdom in Acts 6-7.





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#### Introduction

The story of Stephen in the Book of Acts is one of profound faith, boldness, and sacrifice. As the first Christian martyr, Stephen's life and death provide a compelling example of unwavering trust in God, even in the face of persecution and suffering. His final sermon, recorded in Acts 7, offers a rich tapestry of Israel's history, highlighting God's faithfulness while exposing the hardness of those who reject Him. Stephen's spirit-filled proclamation not only challenges his listeners but also calls believers today to consider their own faith and witness.

Stephen's story begins with his appointment as one of the seven deacons, chosen to serve the early church by managing charitable distributions. However, he quickly became known for performing miraculous signs and speaking with wisdom and the Spirit (Acts 6:8). This drew the ire of certain opposition groups who accused him of blasphemy. Yet, instead of defending himself with mere human arguments, Stephen delivered a powerful sermon recounting God's dealings with His people throughout history, culminating in a call to repentance and faith.

Despite intense hostility, Stephen's faith did not waver. As he was stoned to death, he demonstrated the grace of Christ by praying for his enemies, echoing Jesus' example on the cross. His martyrdom marks a pivotal moment in the early church, igniting widespread persecution but also fueling the spread of the gospel.







This 7-day study invites you to walk through Stephen's sermon and final moments, learning from his example of courage, forgiveness, and trust in God's justice. May his story inspire you to stand firm in your faith and reflect Christ's love and boldness in every circumstance.  $\square$ 

















#### Your Verse

Acts 6:8 - "Now Stephen, a man full of God's grace and power, performed great wonders and signs among the people."

#### Devotional: Stephen: Empowered by the Holy Spirit

Stephen's servant heart was marked by God's grace and power. Before his final sermon and martyrdom, Stephen was known for wisdom, Spirit-filled boldness, and miraculous deeds that served the early church and drew attention from many.

What does it mean to be 'full of God's grace and power'? For Stephen, it was living a life surrendered to God's Spirit, demonstrating love through service and speaking truth with courage. His example reminds us that God equips His servants not with human strength but with supernatural power that transforms lives.

As you begin this study, reflect on how the Holy Spirit empowers you to serve and witness in your everyday life. Are you open to His leading to be bold yet loving? Stephen's life calls us to embrace our role in God's mission with confidence and compassion.

- Joshua 1:9 "Be strong and courageous... for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."







#### Devotional: Courage Rooted in God's Faithfulness

Stephen begins his sermon with a recounting of Abraham's call and God's faithfulness to His promises. This opening sets the tone for Stephen's bold defense, showing God's ongoing work through history.

Stephen's address was not a passive recount but a challenging proclamation. He reminds his listeners that God is always active and calls His people to trust and obedience. Despite threats, Stephen courageously testifies to God's faithfulness, anchoring his message in the Scriptures his audience held dear.

In our own lives, we face situations where defending our faith requires courage and clarity. Stephen's example encourages us to ground our witness in God's story and promises, trusting that God will guide our words.

- Psalm 103:8 "The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love."







#### Devotional: Trusting God's Timing and Presence

Stephen's sermon highlights God's patient presence with His people. The appearance to Moses in the burning bush speaks of God's intimate involvement and timing in redeeming His people.

God does not rush but moves in His perfect timing, often working through seasons of waiting. Like Moses, we may experience long periods of uncertainty or challenge, but God's presence remains constant. Stephen's reminder encourages believers to trust God's timing and remain faithful.

Reflecting on this, consider areas in your life where you need to trust God's patient love amid waiting or hardship. Stephen's example shows enduring faith anchored in God's unchanging nature.

#### Devotional: Guarding Against a Hardened Heart

Stephen rebukes his audience for rejecting God's messengers, echoing the pattern of Israel's resistance throughout history. His words confront not only past disobedience but present hardness of heart.

Resisting the Holy Spirit is a serious condition that hinders our relationship with God and His work in us. Stephen's pointed accusation calls for self-examination—are there ways we resist God's leading today? Are our hearts open or hardened?

Although Stephen's message was difficult, it serves as a reminder that repentance opens the door for God's transformative work. God desires a responsive heart, ready to listen, obey, and receive His grace.

2.	How can you cultivate sensitivity to God's voice and leading?
3.	What steps can you take to soften your heart toward God?

#### Devotional: Grace to Forgive Like Stephen

In his final moments, Stephen exemplifies Christ's love by asking God to forgive his persecutors. His prayer echoes Jesus' words on the cross, demonstrating the radical grace of forgiveness in suffering.

Forgiveness does not minimize hurt but releases the power of bitterness and vengeance. Stephen's example challenges believers to respond to offense and pain with mercy. This act of grace is a testimony to God's transformative power in the heart.

Consider areas in your life where forgiveness may be needed, either toward others or yourself. Stephen's prayer invites us to reflect God's mercy even in the hardest circumstances.
