Devotional: Prayer: The Heartbeat of Leadership

Devotional: Patience Fueling Loving Leadership

Devotional: Faithful and Courageous Teaching

Spiritual leadership involves tenaciously teaching God's truth even when others don't engage. Deuteronomy 6 instructs believers to talk about God's commands continually, weaving faith into everyday life. When your spouse or children seem disinterested, you become the faithful voice reminding your family of God's promises and commands.

This does not mean forcing spirituality but sharing Scripture's wisdom with courage and love. Use moments around the house, car rides, or meal times to introduce God's Word naturally. Remember Proverbs 22:6 — what you plant now in their hearts holds eternal value.

Consistent teaching lays the groundwork for spiritual understanding and transformation over time. Trust that the Holy Spirit is working even when visible signs are absent. Be a dependable source of God's truth and watch how perseverance brings fruit.

Devotional: Hope in God's Faithful Guidance
