Devotional: Accepting Divine Rest to Renew Your Strength

Devotional: God's Power Is Perfected in Weakness

Paul's words remind us that weakness is not a barrier but a gateway to experience God's sustaining power. When you admit your limitations, you open the door for God to work mightily through you.

As a bi-vocational pastor, your energies are often stretched thin, but God's strength is not limited by your fatigue or circumstances. Whenever you feel depleted, pause and invite His grace to replenish you.

Remember, God delights in using your weakness to magnify His strength.
