#### Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Isaiah 40:31 "But those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength."
- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."







#### Devotional: God's Power Shines in Your Weakness

As a caregiver, you may often feel weak, worn out, or inadequate. Yet, God's Word assures us that His grace is enough and that His power shines brightest when we acknowledge our own weaknesses. When you feel drained or overwhelmed, remember that this weakness is not a failure but an invitation to experience God's supernatural strength.

God's power is not measured by human effort but by His ability to uphold us when we can't go any further. Trust in His promises and lean into His grace. Your daily acts of care, love, and patience are not unnoticed by God. He equips you moment by moment so that you can continue with renewed strength.

Whenever you feel discouraged, speak this verse over yourself and ask God to reveal His strength in your weakness. Your journey as a caregiver is hard, but you are empowered by a divine strength far beyond your own.

#### Prayer for Today

Help me to surrender my exhaustion to You and receive Your supernatural strength. Remind me that I do not have to rely on my own abilities but on Your unfailing power. Strengthen my arms, steady my heart, and fill me with Your peace. May I lean on You today and always. In Jesus' name I pray, amen.















#### Your Verse

Colossians 3:12 - "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."
- Luke 6:36 "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful."





#### Devotional: Clothe Yourself with Compassion Daily

Caring for a child with special needs requires deep compassion—not just toward your child, but also toward yourself. Compassion is a divine attribute that reflects God's heart. Scripture calls you, God's chosen, to clothe yourself daily with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. This is not always easy when tired or overwhelmed, but God empowers you to do so through His Spirit.

Compassion flows from understanding and love. When you feel frustrated or exhausted, pause and pray for God to fill your heart with His compassion. Compassion involves empathy and action—it's choosing to respond with tenderness even when the road is hard.

Remember, your compassion is a powerful testimony of God's love. It not only sustains your child but also nurtures your own soul. Allow God's kindness to permeate your daily life and interactions. As you care, trust God to renew a compassionate heart and renew your spirit.

- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."





#### Devotional: Finding Soul Rest in Jesus

Caregiving can be physically and emotionally exhausting, but Jesus invites you into His rest. This rest isn't just sleep but a deep, soul-refreshing peace that comes from being connected to Him. When the weight of responsibility feels overwhelming, consider Jesus' promise to carry your burdens alongside you.

Rest is a gift, not a weakness. Take intentional moments to surrender your cares to God and receive His peace. This may be through prayer, meditation on His Word, or quiet time alone. God understands your struggles and desires to rejuvenate your heart and soul.

Allow yourself permission to rest—not out of laziness, but to replenish your spirit so you can continue caregiving with renewed strength and love. Jesus, who is gentle and humble of heart, walks with you every step.

#### Devotional: You Are God's Masterpiece Today

#### Devotional: Biblical Women Inspire Your Strength

#### Devotional: Let God's Enduring Love Strengthen You

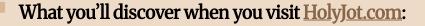




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
