Day 1: Dembracing Your Strength Through God

Devotional: Choosing Patient and Kind Love Every Day

Love in sickness often looks different than in health; it asks for patience when frustrations rise and kindness when the days grow long. *1 Corinthians 13:4* paints a beautiful picture of love that perseveres gently and humbly.

As a husband and caregiver, your love becomes a visible testimony of Christ's sacrificial love. Ephesians reminds us that Christ's love is a self-giving love, not based on feelings but rooted in action. Your acts of love—whether tender words or helping hands—are spiritual offerings that nurture both your spouse's heart and your own strength.

Ask God to mold your heart daily to love beyond the illness, extending grace not only to your spouse but also to yourself. This grace uplifts and sustains.

Allow yourself permission to pause and refresh in God's presence today.

Resting in Him is not laziness but a strength-giving practice, equipping you to continue with renewed energy and perspective.

Feelings of overwhelm are common in caregiving, but God offers a refuge higher than any trial. In Psalm 61:2, the psalmist calls out when heart and strength fail, seeking God as a firm rock.

Isaiah comforts us with the promise of divine presence—no need to fear or be dismayed. Psalm 142 calls God our refuge and portion, emphasizing reliance on Him as sustainer.

When engulfed in stress, cry out to God and allow Him to lift and lead you. His strength transforms weakness into hope and peace.
