Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."
- Psalm 28:7 "The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me."







Day 1: ① God's Strength in Our Weakness

Devotional: God's Power Perfected in Weakness

Veterans often carry wounds unseen and pain that challenges every day. The apostle Paul's words in 2 Corinthians remind us of a powerful truth: *God's grace is sufficient, and His power thrives through our weaknesses*. When physical pain feels relentless, the Lord is our source of supernatural strength — not to eliminate our struggles instantly, but to empower us to endure and even rejoice amidst them.

Physical limitations from combat injuries might feel like barriers, but God invites us to lean into His grace. Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- Isaiah 53:5 "By his wounds we are healed."







Devotional: Trusting God's Healing Promises

Healing is a profound hope for all veterans suffering from combat injuries. God promises restoration — a pledge that transcends physical pain and reaches into the soul and spirit.

Jeremiah's comforting words confirm that God's plan includes healing. While some scars may remain, the Lord's hand brings restoration, mending wounds that seem permanent. This healing manifests not only in our bodies but within hearts battered by trauma and the burdens of pain.

As you meditate on this promise, imagine God's gentle touch binding every injury, soothing every ache. Trust that His love works deeply and powerfully, drawing you or your loved ones from despair toward renewal.

Even when healing takes time or doesn't look as we expect, God is faithfully at work. Hold on to His promises, knowing He will never abandon those who call on Him.

Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 31:24 "Be strong and take heart, all you who hope in the Lord."
- Deuteronomy 31:6 "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."







Day 3: XX Courage Amidst the Battle

Devotional: God Commands Courage in Every Battle

Life's battles don't end with service; many veterans face daily struggles battling pain and limitations. God's command to Joshua echoes through time to those fighting unseen wars — "Be strong and courageous." These words are more than encouragement; they are an assurance that God's presence accompanies every step.

In the thick of hardship, courage is not the absence of fear but the choice to trust God despite it. Veterans may feel discouraged when the body resists or when healing is incomplete. Yet, God calls them (and us) to rise, to draw strength from His abiding presence.

Today, receive God's call to courage as a balm to the weary soul. Know that fear and discouragement have no power where God reigns and goes before us.

Prayer for Today

Lord, I claim Your promise to be with me always. When fear and discouragement creep in, remind me to stand strong and courageous. *Empower every veteran to face daily battles with the boldness that comes from You.* Let Your presence overshadow all doubts and pains. Your Verse

2 Corinthians 1:3-4 - "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."
- Matthew 5:4 "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted."







Devotional: Finding Rest in God's Comfort

Physical pain often brings emotional and spiritual burdens. Veterans affected by combat wounds sometimes endure deep sorrow or loneliness, needing more than healing—they need comfort.

God invites us to rest in His compassionate embrace. He is not distant but intimately acquainted with brokenness. The Apostle Paul praises God as the Father of compassion who comforts us in every trouble.

Let this truth sink deep: in every ache and every silent struggle, God draws near with a comforting presence. Whether through prayer, community, or Scripture, His comfort meets us right where we are.

Today, reach out to the Comforter in your pain or for your veteran loved ones, knowing He heals hearts even when the body still hurts.

2.	List ways God shows compassion in your life currently.
3.	Pray for veterans in pain, asking God to surround them with comfort.

Father of compassion, thank You for being near to the brokenhearted. Please wrap Your loving arms around every veteran who feels crushed by pain or loneliness. *May Your comfort renew their spirit and bring peace beyond understanding.* Help us all to be channels of Your compassion to those who suffer. Your Verse

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Day 5: 💙 Peace Beyond Understanding

Devotional: Receiving God's Supernatural Peace

Pain can rob veterans of inner peace, making each day a battle of mind and spirit. Yet God offers a peace unlike any other — a peace that surpasses human understanding.

Through faith in Christ, our hearts and minds can be guarded despite circumstances. It is not a fleeting feeling but a steadfast calm rooted in trust. This peace holds firm when pain persists and fears arise.

As you meditate on Philippians 4:7, invite God's peace to envelope your heart and mind or those you pray for today. This divine peace is a shelter that shields us from despair and anchors our hope.

Remember, no pain is too harsh to separate us from the peace God freely gives.

Devotional: God's Faithfulness Renews Our Strength

Devotional: Overflowing Hope by the Holy Spirit's Power
