A 7-day journey to embrace faith and peace when diagnosed with cancer, stroke, or end-of-life challenges.





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Introduction

Facing a life-altering diagnosis can be one of the most challenging moments a man can encounter. Whether it is cancer, a stroke, or other serious conditions, uncertainty and fear often arise, clouding hope with worry. Yet, this Bible study seeks to bring *strength*, *faith*, *and peace* to men in these trying moments.

Across Scripture, God invites us to lean on Him when the path is unclear and burdensome. He does not promise the absence of hardship, but He assures His presence, comfort, and peace that surpasses all human understanding. This peace comes not from the absence of struggle but from the presence of Christ, who walks with us and sustains us.

During these seven days, we will explore God's promises and encouragement specifically tailored for men facing profound health challenges. We will reflect on the heroes of faith who persevered, the power of trusting God amidst uncertainty, and the peace available through surrender to His will.

It is our prayer that as you journey through these studies, you will find renewed courage, a steady faith, and an unshakable peace. Let this time be a sacred space to remember that you are not alone — God, your Heavenly Father, is beside you every step of the way.

Your Verse

Psalm 46:1 - "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."

Day 1: **(**) Faith in the Storm

Devotional: Finding God's Strength in Life's Storms

When a diagnosis shakes the very foundations of your life, fear and uncertainty are natural responses. Yet the psalmist declares an unshakeable truth: God is our refuge and strength. This means in the storms of life, including the storm of serious illness, God is not distant or indifferent—He is right there, a stronghold in the whirlwind.

How do you hold on to this promise when everything inside screams doubt? It begins with choosing to fix your eyes on God's character, not the overwhelming circumstances. The Lord invites you to lean on His power rather than your own, understanding that true strength often emerges in the midst of weakness.

Recall Paul's words about grace in 2 Corinthians — your weakness is the very canvas on which God's power is displayed most beautifully. Today, surrender your fear and anchor your faith in this shelter of divine strength.

Prayer for Today

Dear Heavenly Father, thank You for being my refuge and strength in this time of uncertainty. Help me to trust You fully when fear threatens my heart. Remind me that Your grace is enough for every weakness I face. Envelope me in Your peace that carries me beyond the storms. I surrender my fears to You and receive Your perfect power today. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:6-7 "Do not be anxious about anything... And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast because they trust in you."







Devotional: Embracing the Supernatural Peace of Christ

Peace is a gift Jesus offers that contrasts sharply with worldly peace. When facing a life-threatening diagnosis, anxiety and worry may feel constant companions. Yet Jesus promises a peace that does not depend on circumstances — a deep, soul-calming peace that guards your heart and mind no matter what.

How can you embrace this supernatural peace when anxiety tries to take hold? Philippians teaches us prayer is the key: bringing every concern before God with thanksgiving. This transforms anxious thoughts and opens us to His calming presence.

Set your heart to trust God daily; a steadfast mind anchored in Him is protected by perfect peace. Today, invite God's peace to saturate your soul even in the hardest moments, knowing He holds you securely.

3.	What practical steps can you take to cultivate a steadfast mind focused on God?







Journaling Prompts

1.	1. Describe what peace feels like to you in moments of rest or calm.
	2. Write a prayer asking God to guard your heart and mind with His peace.
3.	3. Identify worries you need to consciously give over to God today.







Prayer for Today

Lord Jesus, thank You for Your perfect peace. When anxiety and fear try to overwhelm me, help me to rest in You fully. Guard my heart and mind from the storm inside. Teach me to bring every concern to You with trust and thanksgiving, receiving the peace that only You can give. I choose to lean into Your calm strength this day and every day. *Amen.* Amen.

Devotional: Bold Courage Through God's Presence

Courage is more than the absence of fear; it is acting in faith despite fear.

Receiving a serious health diagnosis can usher in feelings of terror and discouragement. But God's command through Joshua is clear: be strong and courageous, for He is with you no matter what.

What does courage look like for you today? Courage may be humble — the quiet prayer whispered in the dark, the choice to trust God for one more day, the decision to seek help when overwhelmed.

Remember that God's Spirit empowers you with strength, love, and self-discipline — qualities needed to navigate these unknown waters. This divine courage sustains you beyond your own capabilities and empowers you to face the future with hope.

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3.	3. List personal fears you want God to give you courage to face.







Prayer for Today

Father God, grant me the courage to face each new day with faith, not fear. Remind me that You are always by my side, never leaving me alone in this journey. Fill me with Your Spirit's power, love, and self-discipline to confront uncertainties boldly. Help me stand strong and trust in Your faithful promises. *I am not discouraged because You are with me. Amen.*

Devotional: Anchoring Life in God's Unfailing Hope

Hope is not merely wishful thinking; it is confident expectation rooted in the character of God. When confronting serious illness, it's easy to lose sight of hope. Yet Scripture reminds us God wants to fill you with joy and peace as you trust Him, resulting in an overflowing hope.

Where do you place your hope today? The hope God offers is living and active, anchored in Jesus' resurrection and the promise that He has plans for your good.

This hope transforms despair into joy, fear into peace, and helplessness into expectation. It is the anchor that holds steady through raging storms, guiding you toward the horizon where God's faithfulness will never fail.

Day 5: 🏶 Trusting God's Sovereignty

Devotional: Embracing Trust in God's Sovereign Plan

Life's trials often challenge our understanding and plans. A diagnosis can bring questions without answers and feelings of confusion. God calls you to trust Him with all your heart, submitting even the painful parts of your journey into His hands.

What does it look like to trust God when you don't understand the 'why'? It means surrendering personal control and leaning fully on God's wisdom and sovereignty, even when circumstances seem unfair or overwhelming.

Recognize that God's thoughts and ways transcend human logic, and He orchestrates all things together for your ultimate good. By trusting Him, you are aligned with a greater purpose beyond what you can see today.

Prayer for Today

Lord, teach me to trust You wholeheartedly, especially when I don't understand. Help me to lean not on my own limited understanding but fully submit my ways to You. Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."
- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."







Day 6: 🎇 Strengthened Through Weakness

Devotional: God's Power Perfected in Our Weakness

Physical weakness from illness can feel devastating, but spiritually, God's power shines most brightly in our frailty. Paul's words to the Corinthians reveal a paradox: God's grace meets you right where you are and His power is perfected through your weakness.

How can you embrace your weaknesses as a place where God's strength is revealed? This requires a shift in perspective—from self-reliance to Godreliance, from despair to hope.

Psalm 73 assures us that even if our physical bodies fail, God remains our eternal strength and portion. Embrace God's sustaining grace today and find joy in the power that comes from depending fully on Him.

Prayer for Today

Gracious God, thank You that Your grace is more than enough for every weakness I face. When my body is weary and my spirit is tired, remind me that Your power is most perfect in my frailty. Help me to rejoice in my dependence on You and find strength in Your sustaining love. Carry me through with Your overwhelming grace. *Amen.* *

- 2 Corinthians 5:1 "For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven."







Day 7: Hope for Eternity

Devotional: Anchored in Eternal Hope and Peace

While grappling with life's fragility, eternal hope offers profound comfort. God promises a future where pain, death, and sorrow are no more. This assurance gives men facing end-of-life conditions a reason to look beyond present suffering to everlasting peace.

How does the hope of eternity influence your perspective on today's trials? Jesus declares Himself the resurrection and the life—through Him, death is not the end but a transition into eternal joy and restoration.

Cling to this hope as an anchor for your soul. Your earthly struggles are temporary; the glory prepared for you is eternal. Let this promise fill you with peace, confidence, and a renewed sense of purpose even now.
