Day 1: Wood's Strength in Weakness

#### Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

Day 1: Weakness

#### Devotional: God's Power Perfected in Our Weakness

Living with congestive heart failure often means confronting limitations and feelings of weakness. Philippians 4:6-7 – "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

# Supporting Scriptures

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."
- Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."







# Devotional: Experience God's Unshakable Peace Today

Often, health concerns like congestive heart failure can stir deep anxiety and fear about the future. Paul's encouragement in Philippians 4:6–7 teaches us to bring all our worries to God in prayer with thanksgiving. Instead of letting anxiety consume us, we are invited to rest in the peace God freely gives—a peace that surpasses human understanding.

Jesus reassured His followers in John 14:27 that His peace differs from worldly assurance. It calms the heart and mind even amid turmoil. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that the Lord draws near when our spirit is crushed and our hearts feel overwhelmed. God's comforting presence is available to you each moment you turn to Him.

**Embrace today** the peace that comes from casting your cares on God. Let prayer be your refuge and thanksgiving your weapon against anxiety. Even in uncertain health, your heart can be protected by His perfect peace, a peace that refreshes your soul and guards you through every challenge.

# Devotional: God's Tender Healing for Heart and Soul

# Devotional: Every Breath a Gift from God

# Devotional: Finding Rest for Your Weary Soul
