Devotional: Embrace Grief as a Sacred Process

In times of profound loss, it is vital to acknowledge your grief. Ecclesiastes reminds us there is a proper time for everything, including the time to weep and mourn. Denying pain can delay healing, but facing it allows God's comfort to flow freely.

Your feelings—sadness, confusion, even anger—are valid and belong to this journey. Psalm 42 shows a soul wrestling with despair yet choosing to place hope in God. You can do the same. Bringing your raw emotions before God invites His healing presence and true comfort. **Mourning is not weakness but a sacred step toward restoration.** As you reflect today, be patient and gentle with yourself. Allow God to meet you where you are, accepting your sorrow, and nurturing hope within it. He doesn't rush grief but walks it with you.

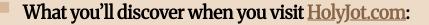




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
