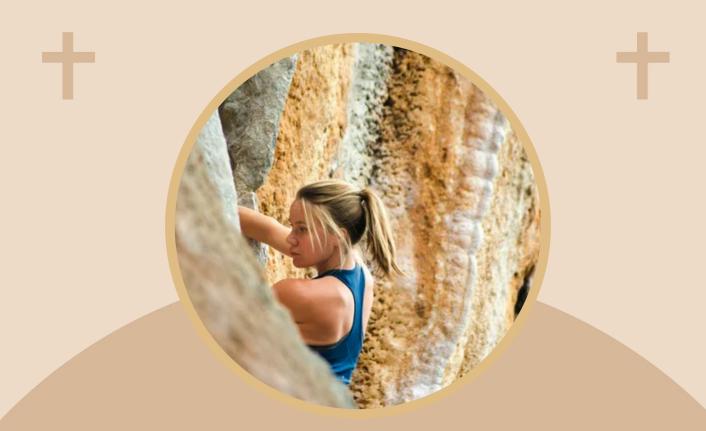
Strengthened in Spirit: Encouragement for Women as the Body Grows Weaker

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:31 "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength." They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary."
- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."







Day 1: **B** Embracing Strength in Weakness

Devotional: God's Power Perfected in Our Limits

Feeling weaker physically is a reality many of us face with time, but Scripture reminds us that God's grace and power are most evident in our weakness. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians reveal a profound truth: when we acknowledge our limitations, God's strength fills the gap. Instead of despairing over fading physical energy, we can boast in our dependence on His sustaining power.

Often, women tend to define themselves by what they can do physically — the vigor, the activity, the role they play. Yet God invites us to redefine strength by leaning into Him. When our bodies are tired, we can turn inward and upward toward the wellspring of hope that never runs dry.

Prayer for Today

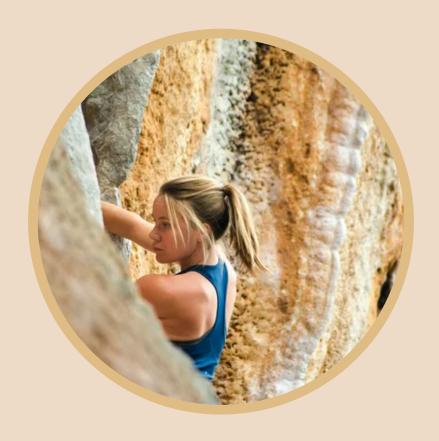

Prayer for Today

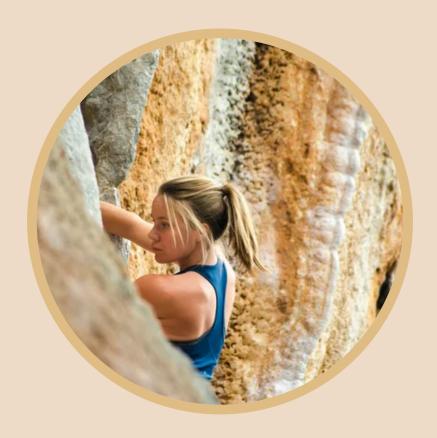

Devotional: Flourishing Spiritually Despite Physical Limits

Psalm 92 paints a vivid picture of flourishing like a palm tree or cedar, symbols of enduring life and strength. Titus calls older women to roles of teaching, kindness, and reverence. These tasks may not demand physical exertion, but they bring eternal impact. Your wisdom and faithfulness serve as a testimony and a source of encouragement to others.

Jesus modeled purpose perfectly by focusing on the work God gave Him, regardless of physical hardship. Your purpose is not bound by your body's strength but by your desire to obey and serve God. What you do in spirit matters infinitely more than what you can do physically.

Prayer for Today

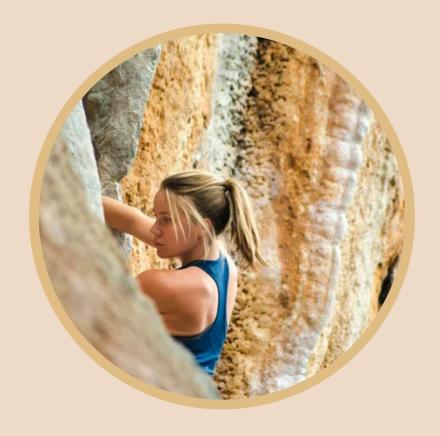

Day 5: SFinding Rest in God's Presence

Devotional: God's Rest as Renewal for Body and Spirit

Day 6: 🕙 The Power of Hope and Waiting

Devotional: Waiting with Hope Strengthens the Spirit

Waiting and slowing down can feel frustrating, especially when physically limited, but Scripture shows waiting as an active posture of hope and trust. Lamentations offers a beautiful depiction of God's goodness to those who place their hope in Him and wait quietly for His salvation. Far from being passive, this waiting involves seeking God and trusting His timing.

Paul encourages us to wait patiently for what we hope for, understanding that hope sustains us during uncertainty. This is especially true when your body does not respond as it once did or when healing seems slow.

Psalm 27 calls for strength and courage while waiting on the Lord. Patience paired with faith forms a resilient spirit that doesn't give in to despair. Your hope anchors you deeply, reminding your soul that God's promises remain true, no matter your physical condition.

Today, be encouraged to wait with hope. Your spirit grows stronger as you trust God's perfect timing.
