Devotional: God's Call to Ordinary Men

The twelve disciples. A group of twelve ordinary men from varied walks of life. Fishermen, a tax collector, perhaps someone impulsive like Peter, and even a doubter like Thomas. Yet, Jesus called them personally. This calling wasn't about their status or education but about their availability and heart to follow Him.

Devotional: From Failure to Foundation

Peter's journey is one of great highs and painful lows. Jesus calls him the rock on which He will build His church, yet Peter famously denies Jesus three times before the crucifixion. How can the foundation be a man who falters?

This story reminds us Jesus does not expect perfection, but faith and repentance. Peter's story is powerful because it shows God's grace in restoration. Even after failure, Jesus gives Peter a purpose, commanding him to 'feed my sheep.'

We often feel weighed down by our mistakes, hesitant to serve or be used by God, fearing we aren't worthy. But Peter's example teaches us that failure is not final. Jesus meets us in our brokenness and calls us again to use our gifts and experiences for His glory.

How often do we overlook the power of inviting others into relationship with Jesus? Andrew's example shows us the significance of small acts of faithfulness — bringing one person at a time to Christ impacts eternity.

- *Mark 2:14 – "As he passed by, he saw Levi son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax collector's booth. 'Follow me,' Jesus told him, and he got up and followed Him."*
- *Luke 5:27-28 – "After this, Jesus went out and saw a tax collector by the name of Levi sitting at his tax booth. 'Follow me,' Jesus said to him..."*



Devotional: Grace Extends to All

Matthew's calling is a profound testimony of grace. Seen as a sinner and outsider because of his profession, Matthew's life was not one people expected to be transformed.

Yet Jesus knowingly called him to follow, offering new life and purpose. Matthew responded by leaving his old life and becoming a committed disciple, even writing one of the four Gospels.

This reminds us that no past is too dark, no reputation too tarnished, for God's redeeming love. God can take any person and use them to impact the world. Matthew's story challenges us to trust in God's grace and to take courageous steps of obedience regardless of our past.

Devotional: Faith Grown Through Questions

Thomas often gets labeled as the doubter, but his story shows a faith journey many can relate to. After Jesus' resurrection, Thomas struggled to believe without seeing. What followed was Jesus' gentle invitation to touch and examine Him.

This encounter led Thomas to proclaim a powerful declaration of faith, calling Jesus 'My Lord and my God.' His story encourages us that doubt is not the enemy of faith. Rather, honest questioning can lead to deeper understanding and trust.

Don't be afraid to bring your doubts and questions to Jesus. He welcomes them, meets them, and offers reassurance. From Thomas, we learn that faith grows as we seek Him earnestly.

Philip's journey shows that faithfulness in small steps—trusting Jesus and sharing Him—is significant for God's Kingdom. We don't have to make grand gestures; simple obedience opens doors for God's work.

Consider your own steps of faith today. Is there a small obedience or sharing opportunity Jesus is asking you to take? Philip inspires us to trust in God's leading and say 'yes' when He calls.

Bartholomew, also called Nathanael, was initially skeptical about Jesus. Yet Jesus knew his heart, calling him ‘an Israelite in whom there is no deceit.’ His honesty and integrity captured Jesus’ attention.

This reminds us that Jesus meets us fully, seeing beyond our doubts and struggles, understanding our true selves. He invites us to ‘come and see’—to explore faith even amid questions.

Bartholomew’s story encourages us to approach Jesus honestly and trust that He knows and accepts us completely. No matter what we feel or think, Jesus welcomes us as we are, inviting us into a deeper relationship.
