#### Devotional: God's Warning: The Altar Breaks at Bethel

The breaking of the altar at Bethel was a shocking, visible sign from God. When King Jeroboam crafted altars outside the Lord's chosen place of worship in Jerusalem, God responded with a dramatic statement. The altar split, with water pouring out—a powerful reminder that worship must honor God's commands and heart. This event warns us today: when we compromise our relationship with God or worship in ways not pleasing to Him, there will be consequences.

God's altar symbolizes His desire for holy worship. When the altar broke, it was as if God was saying, "This division, this false worship, will not stand." It calls us to examine whether our worship is authentic or merely ritual. Is our devotion rooted in God's truth, or have we settled for substitutes? The Bethel altar challenges us to live holy lives that honor God fully.

Through this, God reveals His justice and holiness, but also His willingness to warn us and redirect our paths. May we respond with hearts open to correction and a renewed commitment to worship Him rightly.

# Devotional: The Altar: God's Meeting Place with His People

The altar is more than just a physical structure; it symbolizes the sacred meeting place between God and His people. In the Old Testament, altars were built as places of sacrifice, worship, and covenant. They represented the holiness of God and the cost of drawing near to Him. God's instructions to build altars of earth or stone pointed to His desire for humble, sincere worship rather than extravagant displays.

The altar at Bethel was intended as a counterfeit—an attempt to create worship on human terms rather than God's. It teaches us that God's presence cannot be manipulated or confined to man-made images or places. True connection with God requires obedience and reverence.

Paul reminds us in Hebrews that through Jesus, we now have a spiritual altar where our sacrifices of praise and lives meet God's holiness. Understanding the altar's symbolism helps deepen our appreciation for Christ's work and the personal relationship God invites us into.

#### Devotional: The Danger and Cost of False Worship

**False worship has serious consequences.** In the passage, King Jeroboam's creation of golden calves and improper altars led Israel away from true worship and eventually toward the nation's downfall. God's anger was evident through the altar split, showing His rejection of idolatry and insincere devotion.

False worship is not merely about idols made of gold; it includes anything that replaces God's rightful place in our hearts. Whether pride, materialism, or empty rituals, these substitutes can break the relationship between God and His people. Isaiah's rebuke of meaningless offerings reminds us that God desires obedience and sincerity over sacrifice.

However, God's rejection of false worship is also a call to repentance. Psalm 95's invitation to bow down emphasizes God's compassion and desire for restored fellowship. Today, we must guard our hearts and worship in a way that pleases God.

This day invites us to embrace God's mercy. No matter how far we stray, His compassion awaits. Our response should be humble repentance and a renewed commitment. The altar split points us not only to judgment but also to God's longing to heal and reconcile.

#### Devotional: Building Altars That Honor God's Heart

Altars must be built with God's heart and purpose. Jacob's obedience to build an altar at Bethel was an act of worship, remembrance, and covenant affirmation. This contrasted sharply with Jeroboam's altar, which was born from political ambition and compromise.

God desires that we construct spiritual altars in our lives based on obedience, faith, and love. These altars are daily acts of serving, trusting, and surrendering to Him. They are not physical monuments but expressions of our inner devotion.

When our hearts align with God's purposes, our altars become sacred places where God shows up in power. It's a call to build and maintain intimacy with God through prayer, worship, and obedience.

This truth calls us to surrender fully to Jesus, letting Him be the center of our worship and lives. The altar split reminds us that human efforts fail, but Christ's sacrifice succeeds completely. In Him, we find forgiveness, healing, and new life.
