


Scripture deeply, ask questions, and lean on God's Spirit for understanding. Stay alert—spiritual vigilance is our call and shield.

These character traits—a prideful, blasphemous leader who seeks to replace God—serve as a clear signal for believers to stay awake and discerning. The Antichrist is not subtle in his opposition to God, but his rise involves deception, appearing initially as a solution to chaos. This contrast makes spiritual vigilance essential.

Pray today for wisdom to identify when the spirit of the Antichrist is working around and within you, so you may resist it boldly.
