Your Verse

1 Samuel 5:6 - "The hand of the LORD was heavy on the people of Ashdod, and he afflicted them with tumors."

Supporting Scriptures

- Exodus 25:10–22 "Make an ark of acacia wood... and put in it the testimony..."
- Deuteronomy 28:60 "He will bring upon you all the diseases of Egypt..."







Devotional: God's Sovereignty Displayed Through Judgment

The capture of the ark by the Philistines was more than a military loss for Israel. It was a direct encounter with God's holiness and power.

In 1 Samuel 5, we see how God's judgment manifested as tumors upon the people of Ashdod. This wasn't random suffering—it was a sign of God's displeasure at the ark being taken and treated irreverently.

The ark represented God's presence, a sacred covenant between God and His people. When moved into enemy hands, it disrupted the spiritual balance and reminded us that God's power cannot be contained or controlled by human hands.

This teaches us that God is sovereign over all nations and his holiness demands respect. Even today, God's power may confront us in ways we do not expect, showing that He is not limited by human plans or prejudices.

Reflect on how you respond when God's plans override your own. Are you open to recognizing His power, even in unexpected and difficult circumstances?

1 Samuel 6:4 - "Put the ark of the LORD on a new cart and take it from the house of Abinadab on a new cart..."

- Psalm 91:6 "Nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday."
- Exodus 8:17 "The frogs will come up on you and your people and all your officials."







Devotional: God's Authority over Nature and Nations

The rats and tumors sent upon the Philistines were a powerful plague that affected the whole region. The biblical text tells us that a great number of rats accompanied the tumors, symbolizing devastation and impurity.

In ancient cultures, rats were associated with destruction and disease. This plague showed that God's judgment was comprehensive and unmistakable.

The Israelite priests instructed the Philistines to return the ark using a new cart pulled by cows that had never been yoked, symbolizing purity and obedience to divine instructions. The method of return emphasized that God's presence cannot be manipulated or held captive; it moves by His command.

This reminds us of God's authority over nature and nations alike. Just as He controls plagues, He also provides pathways for restoration and healing when we follow His ways.

Consider how God's judgment is always tempered by his offer of mercy and restoration if we turn back to Him.

- Exodus 32:19 "Moses saw the calf and burned it in the fire."







Devotional: The Holiness of God Demands Reverence

The story takes a sobering turn when the people of Beth Shemesh look into the ark and are struck down. God's presence is not something to be treated casually or with irreverence.

This incident teaches us that the Holy God cannot be confined or manipulated. His presence is powerful and demands respect.

It reminds believers that true worship requires reverence, awe, and careful obedience. Just as the ark's power impacted nations, God's presence in our lives transforms everything around us.

Are you approaching God with the reverence He deserves? Or have you become too familiar, forgetting His majesty and holiness?

1 Samuel 5:6 - "He afflicted them with tumors, both Ashdod and its territory."

- Leviticus 13:2 "The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'When anyone has a swelling or a rash or a shiny spot on their skin..."
- Psalm 38:7 "My back is filled with searing pain; there is no health in my body."







Day 4: 💙 Golden Tumors: Symbols of Sin and Consequence

Devotional: Sin's Bitter Cost Masked as Blessing

The golden tumors are an arresting image combining riches with suffering. While gold usually symbolizes blessing, here it is linked with disease and judgment.

This paradox illustrates how sin corrupts what is valuable and beautiful, turning blessing into burden.

The tumors reveal the consequence of rejecting God's covenant and trying to possess His presence for selfish gains. It is a call to examine our own hearts and recognize areas where sin may be masquerading as blessing or success.

How does this challenge you to align your values with God's standards, not the world's?

1 Samuel 6:12 - "The cows went straight up toward Beth Shemesh, keeping on the road and lowing as they went..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 34:17 "The righteous cry out, and the LORD hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles."
- Isaiah 41:10 "Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







Devotional: Faith in God's Guiding Hand

When returning the ark, the Philistines used a new cart and untethered cows that went straight toward Beth Shemesh. This was a clear sign that God was in control of the situation and was orchestrating His deliverance.

God's deliverance often comes in unexpected ways, using even our enemies or circumstances to accomplish His purpose.

Trusting God means believing He is working—even when we face trials or confusion. Our faith is strengthened when we see God's hand directing the path, just as the cows faithfully followed His lead.

Where might God be leading you today, even if the path seems uncertain?







Reflect and Apply

How do you usually respond when God leads in unexpected ways?
What helps you trust God's deliverance during hard times?
Can you identify a recent example of God's guidance in your life?

Devotional: Embracing Spirit-Led Worship

The story of the ark calls us back to true worship. God desires worship that honors His holiness and acknowledges His presence with reverence and joy.

True worship is not about rituals or physical objects alone, but about the condition of our heart—worshiping in spirit and truth.

As believers, we are called to offer ourselves fully to God, living lives that reflect His glory. The ark was a physical symbol of God's presence, but Jesus teaches us that worship transcends physical space and happens in the Spirit.

Devotional: Hope in God's Unfailing Mercy

Though the story of the ark includes judgment and suffering, it ultimately points to God's mercy. The Philistines were forced to return the ark, ending their affliction and restoring peace.

Similarly, God's great love extends beyond judgment to forgiveness and renewal. His faithfulness is constant, and His compassion knows no end.

In our own lives, we can rest in God's mercy, confident that He forgives, heals, and restores. Even when consequences come, His grace assures us that we are never beyond His reach.

Embrace the hope that flows from God's faithful love today.

3.	What steps can you take to live in the assurance of His faithfulness?
