#### Introduction

Welcome to this 21-day Bible study plan centered around a sobering and deeply challenging passage from the book of Judges — the story of the Levite and his concubine in *Judges 19*. This narrative unfolds a dark chapter in Israel's history, where the tragic consequences of moral decay and societal breakdown are starkly portrayed. As we journey through these three weeks together, we will explore how this grim tale reflects the broader spiritual and cultural condition when "everyone did what was right in their own eyes" (Judges 21:25). This phrase captures the essence of chaos that ensues when God's standards are ignored and replaced by human discretion and selfish ambition.

Throughout these 21 days, we will weave Scripture passages that provide insight into God's perspective on justice, righteousness, community, and repentance. We will confront challenging questions about our own hearts and cultures, asking whether we too are tempted to justify actions by personal preference rather than divine instruction. Yet, in walking through this story of darkness, we will also discover enduring lessons about God's holiness, His grief over sin, and His desire to restore His people to faithful living.

This journey will call for honest reflection and spiritual openness. It is not only a study of ancient history but also a mirror for our present condition. The Bible reveals that when people stray from God's ways, brokenness and violence follow—a truth as relevant today as it was in the days of the judges. But God's love and truth never abandon us. Through Scripture and prayer,







you will be encouraged to seek God's guidance for personal and communal transformation.

Prepare your heart to be challenged, convicted, and encouraged. Let this study foster a deeper understanding of the Bible's power to expose sin, call us to repentance, and invite us into a restored relationship with the Holy God who, even in judgment, extends mercy and grace.

#### Devotional: Judges: A Time of Turmoil and Moral Chaos

The book of Judges sets the stage for understanding the chaotic period Israel faced between Joshua and the establishment of monarchy. The cycle of sin, oppression, repentance, and deliverance marks most of its narrative. Different from the orderly conquest under Joshua, Judges reveals a time when faithfulness faltered and God raised leaders, or judges, to rescue His people momentarily. As we start, reflect on the repeated phrase "everyone did what was right in their own eyes." This picture of spiritual anarchy foreshadows the event we will focus on later — the Levite and his concubine's tragic story in chapter 19. It reveals what happens when community and moral law break down.

Let us begin by inviting God's Spirit to open our eyes to His truth, especially when we wrestle with pain and darkness that emerge from sin's consequences. The setting reminds us that life apart from God's rule inevitably spirals into disorder and suffering.

#### Your Verse

Judges 19:1 - In those days when there was no king in Israel, a Levite man from the mountains of Ephraim took a concubine from Bethlehem in Judah.

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Genesis 19:1 The two angels came to Sodom in the evening, and Lot was sitting in the gateway of the city.
- Hebrews 13:2 Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it.







Day 2: 
The Tragedy Begins: Hospitality Tested

#### Devotional: Sacred Hospitality Violated in Gibeah

Hospitality in biblical times was sacred. It reflected respect, safety, and Godhonoring community standards. This account opens with a Levite and his concubine journeying to Bethlehem, intent on staying one more night before returning home. However, their stay in Gibeah, a clan town of Benjamin, turns ominous.

The story draws similarities with other Old Testament narratives like Sodom, where the sanctity of hospitality collapses into violent perversion. When the men of the city demand to abuse the Levite, the host protects his guest by offering his own daughter and concubine instead, highlighting the community's depraved state and distorted value system.

This tragic deterioration of hospitality signals comprehensive moral collapse. It is a snapshot of a society far removed from God's protection and order. As we reflect today, consider how the sacredness of community and protection of the vulnerable is foundational in Scripture and what it means when these are discarded.

Day 3: 1 Darkness Falls: The Levite's Concubine

#### Devotional: Confronting Violence and Brokenness

The horror of chapter 19 reaches its depth here. The concubine is brutally abused by the men of Gibeah — a devastating act of violence that strips dignity, safety, and life. The passage reveals profound evil and the tragic effects of lawlessness when society rejects God's justice.

While this account is heartbreaking and difficult, Scripture doesn't shy away from showing human brokenness openly. It reminds us that God is profoundly grieved by sin and injustice and that darkness must be confronted.

Yet even here, hope quietly exists. God draws close to the brokenhearted (*Psalm 34:18*) and calls His people to seek justice, mercy, and humility (*Micah 6:8*). We are invited to grieve with those who suffer and to commit ourselves to walking in righteousness amidst a fallen world.

#### Devotional: Responding to Sin with Godly Justice

The Levite's drastic act of dismembering his concubine's body and sending the pieces to all Israel was a shocking call to action. It served as a grim wake-up, exposing the depths of depravity and demanding national accountability. His response, while emotionally charged and steeped in grief, sparked outrage and eventually civil war.

This part of the narrative highlights the tension between human responses to sin and God's call for righteous justice. The Apostle Paul warns against personal revenge but encourages trust in God's justice (*Romans 12:19*), while the prophets emphatically call God's people to actively seek justice and defend the vulnerable (*Isaiah 1:17*).

**God's people are responsible to uphold His justice,** though the means and timing must align with His holiness and wisdom. This chapter encourages reflection on how we respond to sin around us — with measured, spirit-led action or reckless impulses.

#### Devotional: Choosing God's Way Over Our Own

The phrase concluding Judges powerfully summarizes the nation's struggle: "everyone did what was right in their own eyes." This utter moral freedom, untethered from divine authority, led Israel into confusion and violence. Without a king or godly leadership, the people's actions spiraled into lawlessness.

Proverbs warns us that human reasoning, while often convincing, can lead to destruction (*Proverbs 14:12*). The human heart is fallen and requires God's guidance faithfully to live rightly. Paul's reminder that all have sinned (*Romans 3:23*) puts us on equal footing with ancient Israel in our need for God's grace and transformation.

**Reflecting on this verse invites us to examine** the sources of our own moral compass. Are we guided by God's Word or our personal preferences? How can we submit more fully to God's reign in our lives to avoid similar decline?

- Colossians 3:13 Bear with each other and forgive one another.







## Devotional: God's Design for Family and Restoration

At the heart of this tragic story is a fractured relationship. The Levite's concubine left him, sparking a chain of sorrow and violence. While the details are sparse, the pain of broken trust and unresolved conflict is evident.

God's design for family relationship centers on love, faithfulness, forgiveness, and reconciliation. Paul urges husbands to love sacrificially (*Ephesians 5:25*) and all believers to carry one another's burdens with grace (*Colossians 3:13*). This broken relationship invites us to reflect on the importance of nurturing relationships marked by trust and mercy.

While brokenness is part of human experience, God calls us to heal and restore. We can find hope that even the darkest relational wounds are not beyond His redeeming power.

Psalm 34:18 reminds us that God is not distant from our pain but intimately present, offering comfort and salvation. In Isaiah, the Messiah is described as one who brings healing and liberation to the oppressed and hurting.

Jesus himself invites the weary to come to Him for peace (*Matthew 11:28*). These truths are vital when facing stories of profound suffering. They echo hope through grief and injustice — God's love transforms brokenness.

Whatever your brokenness today, know that God's compassionate presence surrounds and sustains you. He understands pain and offers rest for wounded souls.

## Devotional: God's Provision for Leadership

The repeated phrase in Judges, 'there was no king in Israel,' underscores the nation's spiritual chaos and need for godly leadership. When the Israelites demanded a king, Samuel was dismayed, but God authorized this change as part of His sovereign plan.

Leadership profoundly impacts the moral health of a nation. Proverbs states that righteous leadership brings joy, whereas wicked rule causes suffering. Paul teaches believers to respect governing authorities, understanding that all authority stems from God.

This tension highlights our dependence on God-ordained leaders who follow His ways and shepherd His people in righteousness. It also invites personal responsibility to submit to God's order and pray for those who lead.

However, the New Testament calls believers to reject sin's entanglement and run after holiness. The cost of sin is grave, but so is God's mercy and invitation to new life through Jesus—who pays the ultimate price so we may be restored.

Understanding sin's cost drives us to repentance, dependence on grace, and a deeper hunger for purity.

Walking humbly opens our hearts to God's leading and aligns us with His kingdom values. It softens pride and prepares us to act justly and love mercy as God calls us.

God's call for holiness distinguishes His people from the brokenness around them. Peter reminds believers that just as God is holy, so we must pursue holiness. This means living set apart in attitude, action, and purpose.

Paul encourages us to offer our lives fully to God as an act of worship. Hebrews stresses that holiness is essential for encountering the Lord.

Though surrounded by moral decline like in Judges, God calls us to shine with purity and faithfulness. Holiness is not about perfection but about continual surrender and transformation empowered by God's Spirit.
