#### Your Verse

Day 1: 🗱 God's Promise to Zechariah

#### Devotional: Trusting God's Perfect Timing

**Zechariah's encounter with the angel is a powerful moment of divine intervention.** After years of unanswered prayers for a child, Zechariah's quiet service in the temple is interrupted by a message that changes everything. The angel's words, "your prayer has been heard," remind us that God listens closely to the longings of our hearts, even when fulfillment seems delayed.

This day invites you to reflect on the nature of God's promises. Sometimes, we may feel forgotten or doubting when prayers remain unanswered, but like Zechariah, God's timing is perfect. - James 1:6 "But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt..."







#### Devotional: When Doubt Meets God's Promise

**Despite receiving a miraculous promise, Zechariah's initial response was doubt.** His question, though understandable, displayed a lack of faith in God's power. The angel's response was firm yet purposeful — Zechariah would remain silent until the promise was fulfilled.

This silence was more than a punishment; it was a profound lesson in faith and trust. Sometimes, God allows us to face uncomfortable situations to deepen our reliance on Him and refine our belief. Zechariah's muteness served as a sign for both him and others that God's word would surely come true.

In your own journey, doubt may arise, but it can be an opportunity for growth rather than shame. God welcomes sincere questions and invites you to lean on Him more closely as you wait. Reflect on the areas where doubt challenges your faith and be encouraged that God's promises stand firm even when your voice is quieted by uncertainty.










# Day 3: (a) Elizabeth's Unexpected Joy

#### Devotional: Joy in God's Faithfulness

Elizabeth's response, rejoicing in the Lord's deliverance, provides a beautiful example of gratitude and worship in the midst of surprise and blessing. Her story encourages us to celebrate God's interventions, especially when they come in unexpected ways that reverse past disappointments.

Reflect on the joy that comes from embracing God's blessings even when they disrupt our plans or timelines. Like Elizabeth, we can find spiritual renewal and strength when we recognize God's hand in fulfilling His promises.












# Day 5: 7 Zechariah's Prophecy of Hope



#### Devotional: Answering God's Call with Courage










# Day 7: Witnessing God's Faithfulness
