Devotional: Bronze Altar: Where Judgment Meets Mercy

The bronze altar was the first place sanctified in the tabernacle, a symbol of sacrifice and approach to God. God's instructions to Moses in *Exodus 27* meticulously describe making an altar of acacia wood coated in bronze—a metal associated with judgment and purification. This altar was the place where the Israelites brought their burnt offerings, allowing them to be accepted before a holy God.

Why bronze? Because it symbolized strength, endurance, and the consequences of sin. The altar reminds us that approaching God requires the shedding of blood, acknowledging that sin incurs a price. Every sacrifice was a foreshadowing of the ultimate sacrifice that would be made in Christ.

Understanding the bronze altar helps us see that God is just, yet merciful. The altar's presence shows us that while God desires closeness with us, sin creates barriers that must be addressed through sacrifice and cleansing.

Prayer for Today



Devotional: Power of Blood on Altar's Horns

Blood played a sacred role in consecrating and cleansing the altar. In Leviticus, God commands that the blood of the sin offering be applied to the horns of the bronze altar, signifying purification and atonement for the altar itself, which had become defiled by the people's sins.

The altar's horns are often understood to be points of strength and power, and by applying blood there, the altar was cleansed and made capable to accept offerings once again. This process served as a tangible symbol of God's forgiveness and restoration.

Hebrews interprets this ritual as a shadow of Christ's perfect sacrifice, which purges our conscience from dead works to serve the living God. The blood that cleansed the altar on earth was a foreshadowing of the blood that cleanses our hearts, making us fit to approach God not by our own merits but by grace.

Devotional: Holy Fire Consuming Our Sacrifices

The fire consuming offerings on the altar symbolized God's acceptance and presence. When offerings were made, the divine fire affirmed they were pleasing and that atonement between God and people was established. This moment of divine fire represents God's holiness consuming sin and legitimizing the sacrifice.

The fire was not only a physical reality but a spiritual reality—illustrating that God's holiness is powerful and alive. The fire also separated the holy from the profane, emphasizing the necessity of purity in approaching God.

Hebrews reminds us that God is a consuming fire, reinforcing the importance of holiness and reverence. As believers today, we must offer ourselves as living sacrifices, purified and dedicated, allowing God to consume the impurities in our hearts.



Devotional: Christ's Blood: The New Covenant Seal

The concept of blood in the covenant connects the altar sacrifices to God's promises. In Exodus, Moses sprinkled blood on the people as a sign and seal of the covenant, binding them to God through the blood of sacrifice.

This ancient ceremony prefigures the new covenant inaugurated by Jesus Christ, whose blood was shed so that all who believe might receive forgiveness and eternal life. Christ's blood is described as the perfect covenant—the fulfillment of the promises made to Israel and to all who trust in Him.

Reflection on the covenant blood reminds us of God's faithfulness and our responsibility to walk in His ways. It also calls us to live in unity with God's people, sealed by the blood that saves and sanctifies.

3.	Describe how your relationship with God has deepened through understanding the covenant.








Prayer for Today

Devotional: Finding Refuge at the Altar's Horns

The altar's horns symbolize strength and refuge for those seeking protection. Throughout Scripture, the horns of the altar were known as a place where one might flee in desperation, seeking escape from enemies or judgment.

Adonijah's desperate grasp onto the altar's horns illustrates recognition of God's power as a place of sanctuary and mercy. Though the altar was associated with sacrifice and judgment, it was also a place of grace where life could be spared when genuine repentance was offered.

In the New Testament context, we find refuge in Christ, who became our altar and sacrifice. We are invited to lay hold of Him in times of trouble, assurance that He protects, strengthens, and intercedes for us.

Hebrews presents Jesus as the fulfillment of the altar and the ultimate sacrifice. The earthly altar was a shadow, but Christ is our reality—the perfect once-for-all priest and sacrifice.

Through His blood, we are redeemed and invited to present ourselves as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God. The altar no longer requires repeated animal sacrifices because Christ's sacrifice suffices forever.

This truth invites us into a new way of living—one marked by devotion, surrender, and continual cleansing through Christ's blood. We are called to participate in the life of holiness and worship that our Savior secured for us.


Prayer for Today
